

Allerton High celebrates another year of outstanding GCSE and A Level results!

We are extremely proud of our students and delighted that their hard work was rewarded with excellent results in a wide range of subjects. They showed a great deal of determination and resilience and fully deserve the success they achieved. We are also very grateful to all staff and families for the time they devoted to helping and supporting the students.

Exceptional GCSE results 2019

At this stage most students appear to have made very good progress and are pleased with their results. Early indications are that English and Maths results are strong again with 67% of students achieving a grade 5 or higher **in both subjects** (National average in 2018 was 40%) and 33% achieving a 7 or higher in both. Attainment across all subjects also remained very high, as did the proportion of 9-7 grades, with more than 15% of students achieving a clean sweep of top grades.

- 67% achieved Grade 5 or above in English & Maths
- 85% achieved Grade 4 or above in English & Maths
- 33% achieved Grade 7 or above in English & Maths
- Attainment 8 is 57.7
- EBacc entry is 68%
- EBacc Average Point Score is 5.04

Amazing A Level Results 2019

2019 has been another fantastic year for Year 13 students at Allerton High School. We were delighted with the exam results our students achieved and the destinations that they secured but also of their varied contributions to the school and local community.

Half of the A level grades awarded were A*, A or B grades and the overall pass rate was 99.4%. 27% of grades achieved were A*/A Grades with 30 of students achieving a clean sweep of top grades. At this stage progress for all students also looks strong.

The vast majority of students seeking a University place were placed this year with strong apprenticeship and sponsored degree programme options also secured. 35% of our students who went to University places were at Russell Group Universities in a diverse range of subjects, including Medicine, Dentistry, Forensic Science, Law and Languages.
