



PE Uniform Policy

Games and Physical Education requirements

- Red/White polo shirt with left breast embroidery school logo. Surname on the back.
- Plain, Navy Blue shorts
- Navy/White socks with school logo
- Majority White lace up sports trainers (no Velcro/pumps/ converse/high tops)

Optional Extras (for both boys and girls)

- Plain, Navy Blue Tracksuit bottoms
- Plain, Red track jacket with left breast embroidery school logo

For Swimming

- Swimming hat – in house colour (available from school - £1)
- Any plain, Navy Blue/Black swimming costume (Girls)
- Any plain, Navy Blue swimming shorts/trunks (above the knee)
- Towel

Recommended items

- Astro-turf moulded studs and pimple soled trainers ONLY
- Shin pads / mouth guard

Please note:

- Pupils who wish to be members of school teams need to be committed to regular practices and matches.
- In PE lessons absolutely no jewellery, without exception, may be worn.
- All pupils should have kit in ALL lessons, including when excused – as pupils will be asked to take on another role.
- Sports trainers should be predominantly white with laces. (No high tops, converse or pumps). Sports trainers require support around the foot and ankle.
- Pupils will be provided with PE kit if they fail to bring their own PE kit to their PE lessons



Expectations & Standards in PE Lessons

Maintaining High Standards in Physical Education Lesson

- Be prompt to lessons and change quickly.
- All items of your PE kit should be named. The school cannot be held responsible for lost items; although we always do our best to return named kit that is handed in.
- Correct kit is to be worn for lessons and extra-curricular activities.
- For hygiene reasons, do not wear your school jumper during lessons or tights.
- Hair must be tied back off your face if it in anyway obstructs your vision.
- Proper sports shoes should be worn and must be fastened securely.
- Any equipment or kit that is borrowed should be treated with respect and returned at the end of the lesson to the correct place.
- ALL jewellery to be removed. It has been made clear in a number of newsletters that earrings should be removed and it is therefore not appropriate to get ears pierced during term time.
- Valuables (including jewellery and money) should be handed into the class teacher at the start of the lesson.
- If you need to be excused from a lesson you must bring a note from your parent/guardian.
- All excused students will change into their full kit. Even with a note you will be expected to join in with the lesson in the capacity of coach, official or performer.
- School rewards and sanctions are followed. Detentions will be issued for failure to bring in correct equipment and pupils will be provided with a PE kit.
- Poor behaviour at any point during the lesson (including in the changing rooms) will not be tolerated.
- Please report any unpleasant behaviour that may occur in the changing rooms to a member of staff IMMEDIATELY.
