Art Leaflet

Ardingly Art Department is a vital, energetic centre of creativity. It's an environment where individuality is encouraged and the confidence and freedom to express ideas through a strong base of artistic skill are fostered.

Music Leaflet

Our Music School with its selection of choirs, orchestras and ensembles, provides on-site tuition for almost any instrument. Catering for the classical to the contemporary musician, our young and dynamic team fuel and further musical passions.

Drama Leaflet

The Drama Department provides many opportunities to perform throughout the year, including two major productions. Pupils explore the world and themselves through the art of performance.

Enrichment Leaflet

We have over 70 activities on offer and Senior pupils enjoy three enrichment sessions each week where they can choose from activities in the following categories; Outdoor, Sporting, The Arts, Academic and Life Skills, all playing their part in discovering passions and developing individuals.

The Curriculum

All students are taught by subject specialist staff in their own designated suite of classrooms. Students at all stages are encouraged to follow a curriculum which can be broad though ultimately leading to successful outcomes by focusing on strengths and passions.

Homework

Students in Shell, Remove and Fifth are set between 45 and 60 minutes' homework in two subjects each weekday evening. For boarders, evening School runs between 18.30 and 20.45, Monday to Friday, and is supervised by House Tutors. Day pupils may remain at College to complete their work, either in House or the Library. Remove and Fifth Form students also have some timetabled supervised study periods (SSPs).

Personal Education

All Middle School students follow a comprehensive PSHE programme and Sixth Form have off-timetable days for PSHE and important events such as "Safe Drive, Stay Alive". In addition to educating our students we hold parent information evenings on a range of topics from drug and alcohol abuse to sexual relationships, and from cyber-safety to talking to teenagers.

It is important to prepare students for life beyond Ardingly so that they can take their place in the world with confidence and independence. As part of their enrichment programme they have the opportunity to learn life skills and in the final week of term attend a week of talks and work shops to prepare them to be 'World Ready'.

Learning Support

Ardingly has a professionally staffed Learning Support Department. Its aim, throughout the whole school, is to identify those pupils who demonstrate a special educational need and to make available the appropriate level of support from subject and specialist teachers, working in close consultation with parents, tutors and medical staff.

While the College provides support and specialist teaching to pupils who demonstrate a special educational need, Ardingly is not staffed to support children with advanced or complex educational or psychological difficulties. The College reserves the right not to admit pupils whose needs it cannot meet.

Student Council

Students have a say in how their school is run. The Student Council is a forum to discuss issues affecting the student body. A team of Sixth Form IT Ambassadors lead the way in educating parents, staff and students on how to stay safe online and a Peer Support team provides a listening service to help students talk through their problems and find their own solutions.

Catering

All meals are prepared on-site by our own staff and we offer a wide range of meals to meet all our students' requirements.

Our menus are planned with careful consideration of nutritional content and variety.

The Student Food Committee, with representatives from every year group, meets regularly with catering managers to give feedback and discuss new ideas. Our Catering team have achieved 5 out of 5 on the "Scores on the Doors" and have recently been awarded a Gold in the "Eat out, Eat well" scheme. They are the first catering establishment to achieve this in Mid-Sussex.

Examinations

Students sit examinations in every subject during the Trinity term of Remove, mock examinations in the first half of the Lent term in Fifth and are continually assessed throughout the year. External written coursework is also completed in some subjects.

ADMISSIONS

There are five year groups in the Senior School.

Year 9 or 'Shell'	(age 13 - 14)
Year 10 or 'Remove'	(age 14 - 15)
Fifth Form	(age 15 - 16)
Lower Sixth	(age 16 - 17)
Upper Sixth	(age 17 - 18)

Admission into the Senior School is normally at age 13 into Year 9 or age 16 into the Lower Sixth Form. Students may also gain entry into Year 10, the Fifth Form and occasionally the Upper Sixth if suitable and subject to places being available.

Admission into Year 9 has four parts: an academic pre-test, a meeting with the Headmaster or a senior teacher and a school reference and school report. The purpose of these three elements is to ensure that we can support every pupil to achieve their academic potential, and that there is a good match between a child's interests and abilities and the opportunities we offer at Ardingly.

Candidates for Shell (Year 9) entry in 2019 will be asked to sit the ISEB Common Pre-test in October or November 2017. For 2020+ entry candidates will be asked to sit the ISEB Common Pre-test in the Summer term of Year 6. The Common pre-test is used by many senior schools and welcomed by prep schools and parents, as it requires only one sitting. Parents and children are therefore spared the stress of sitting multiple assessments at different schools. The test is online and is taken at their prep school.

Pupils who are not studying for Common Entrance at a prep school either in the UK or abroad are invited to visit the College to meet the Headmaster and/or senior staff and to sit an entrance assessment.

Admission into Year 10 or the Fifth Form is via written assessments in English, Mathematics and Science and an interview with the Headmaster and/or senior staff. We also require a report and reference from the pupil's previous school.

Admission into the Sixth Form is via written assessments in English, Mathematics and Verbal Reasoning. Candidates will be invited to attend an entrance assessment in November for entry the following September. We require a report and reference from the pupil's previous school. Entry is also subject to the candidate gaining six or more grade 6 passes at GCSE and at least a 5 in both English Language and Mathematics. If the candidate is not sitting GCSEs in his/her current school, an offer of a place will be based on the assessments, report, interview and predicted grades.

Open Mornings

Our Open Mornings provide an opportunity to hear from the Headmaster, meet our teachers and tour the school. During the morning our students bring Ardingly College alive demonstrating activities from our Enrichment Programme. Our artists, scientists, actors, sports boys and girls and musicians seize the opportunity to showcase their particular passion.

We invite visitors to attend a carousel of short talks which will give an insight into an Ardingly education and provide further information about the admissions process.

In addition to the above mentioned scholarships, there is also an Ashdown Leadership Award, which is for candidates who, though not quite strong enough to win an academic award outright, show outstanding all-round ability.

Scholarships and awards are offered on the basis of examinations and interviews held at the College. Non-academic scholarships take place in the Lent term of Year 8 with the ISEB Academic scholarships in the Summer term. All applicants must be registered and deposited with the College to apply for any of our scholarships.

Music scholarships and choral exhibitions are offered on the basis of auditions and interviews held at the College in the Lent term. It is strongly suggested that prospective music scholars arrange a preliminary audition with the Director of Music during the Lent term of Year 7 to gauge suitability for such an award. It must be noted that this pre-audition will have no bearing on subsequent auditions at 13+.

It is stressed that these fees are *inclusive*, i.e. they include all accommodation, normal academic costs (excluding external trips) and appropriate meals. The only extra expenses are for example some text books, exam fees, trips and disbursements. These are charged in arrears on School accounts.

ADDITIONAL EXPENSES

Individual Tuition – Payable in advance:

- Instrumental Music and LAMDA Tuition - £ 247 for 10x30 minute lessons
- Instrument Hire - variable dependent on instrument
- Additional Learning Support - £ 24.70 per 30 minute lesson

ENGLISH AS A SECOND LANGUAGE

Students will be screened on entry where English is their second language to determine if they require this additional provision.

Where identified attendance at these lessons will not be optional. £1,295 per term

SPECIAL PROVISIONS

There are a number of optional specialist provisions which will incur additional fees. These include:

Mandarin - Lessons are timetabled and are optional. £1,295 per term

Please note that if a student is charged for English as a Second Language no fee will be incurred for Mandarin or other languages.

Specialist Sports – Some specialist sport provision is made available to students and will incur additional charges eg Sailing £150 per term.

Payment from Abroad

From time to time some parents resident abroad, without guaranteed funds in a UK bank account, have experienced serious difficulty in overcoming currency control restrictions in respect of the payment of School Fees. For this reason they have been unable to comply with the School Council's requirement that fees must be paid on or before the start of each term. Therefore an additional deposit may be required of one term's fees less the Confirmation of Entry Deposit.

These fees will be held on deposit and used to offset the final term's account. This sum is returnable in the event of the child not joining the School but the confirmation of entry deposit is subject to the conditions stated on the acceptance form.

We strongly recommend that parents transferring money from overseas accounts do so by electronic bank transfer rather than by sending a cheque. Bank charges to process a cheque are very expensive and we will only credit your account with the sterling amount actually received after charges. The cheapest and most convenient method of paying fees (and the deposit) is by direct bank transfer.

INSURANCE SCHEMES

As a service to parents, the College offers various Insurance Schemes. Whilst we in no way wish to influence your personal choice of cover or insurer, we believe the rates offered are very competitive and we can administer each Scheme by including the premium on your child's school bill.

All Inclusive Scheme

Personal Accident Scheme including Dental

You will be reassured to know that the College automatically insures all students against Personal Accident resulting in a permanent injury, such as a lost tooth or damaged eyesight, sustained in or out of school all year round on a world-wide basis. A Factsheet describing the Scheme is included in your Starter Pack.

Optional Schemes

Two further Schemes are available, each of which is highly recommended although completely optional. A Factsheet and Application Form for each Scheme is included in the Starter Pack for new pupils.

Fees Refund Scheme

Should your child be absent from school due to sickness, accident or quarantine, the College is unable to refund any of your school fees except through the Fees Refund Scheme. For a modest premium, a refund of fees can be made for an absence of 8 consecutive days or more for Boarders; 5 days or more for Day Pupils including weekends and half term breaks. This Scheme does not apply to Pre-Nursery and Nursery children who attend school on a sessional basis.

Medical Scheme

The School Doctor emphasises, especially to parents resident abroad, the value of private medical cover such as the AXA PPP Healthcare Scheme offered by the College. The premium from September 2017 is £75.00 per term. An Application Form and Consent Form are included in your Starter Pack.

Not Included - Personal Effects

Please note that the College does not insure students' personal property. It remains the parents' responsibility to insure their child's belongings against all contingencies (including theft) therefore it is strongly recommended that valuable items such as cash, laptops, mobile phones, musical instruments and watches, as well as clothing, are fully covered either by your Household All Risks policy or some other insurance.

BUS ROUTES

The College operates a number of bus services which serve only Ardingly College students. As well as providing a convenient service for parents, the College is committed to reducing the number of vehicles on campus, reducing its carbon footprint and pursuing a sustainable approach to travel. We also wish to address the inherent safety risk from moving traffic, particularly during the busy morning drop-off and afternoon pick-up times.

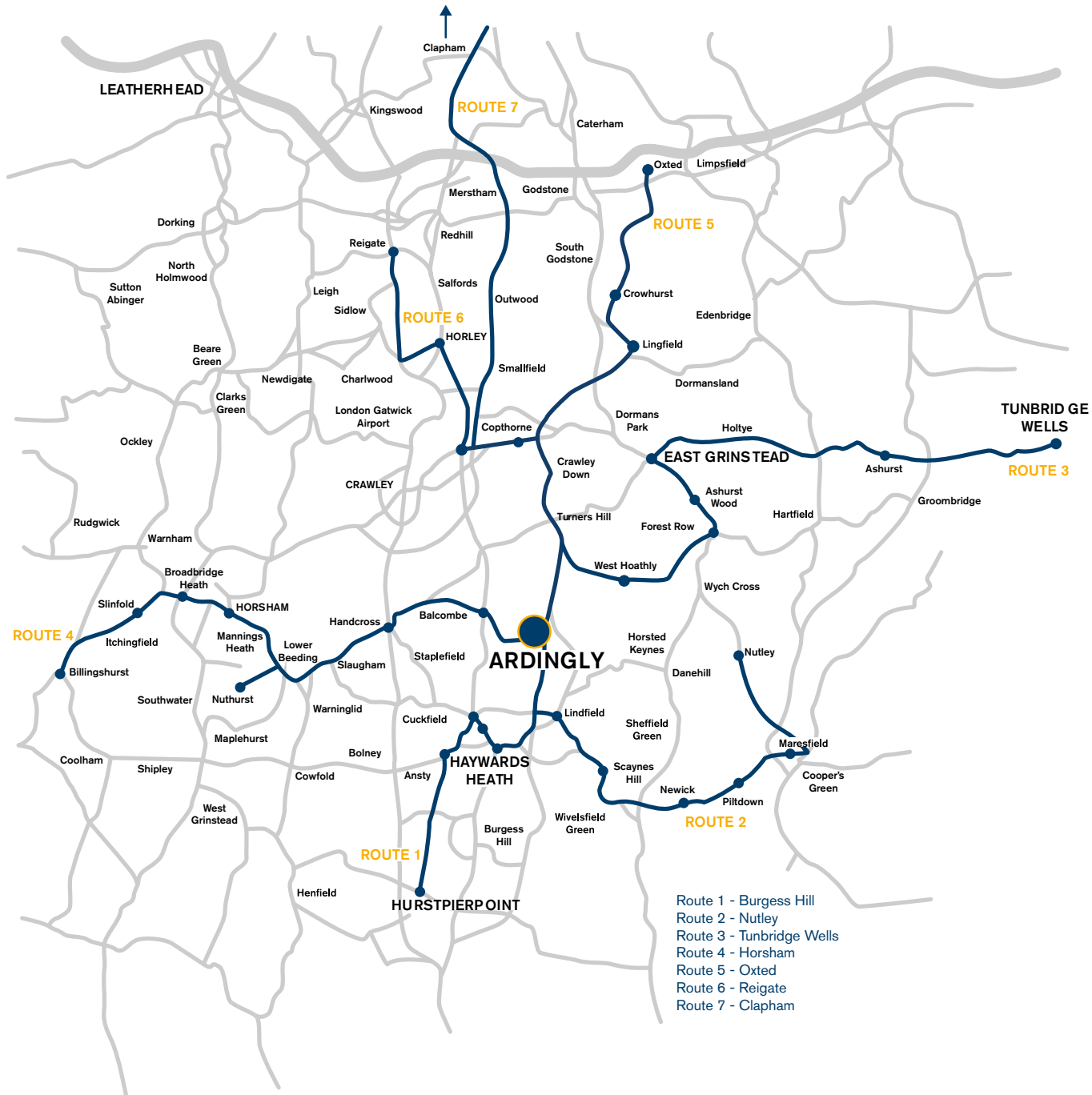

HOW TO FIND US

By Air

London Gatwick Airport is 10 miles away. Heathrow, Luton and Stansted airports are also within easy reach via the M25 and M23.

By Rail

The nearest mainline station is Haywards Heath (on the London to Brighton railway line) which is a 10 minute taxi journey from Ardingly.

By Road

Ardingly College is located between Crawley and Haywards Heath close to the M23, A23 and A272 just 35 miles south of London and 20 miles north of Brighton, making it easily accessible via the UK road network.

From London

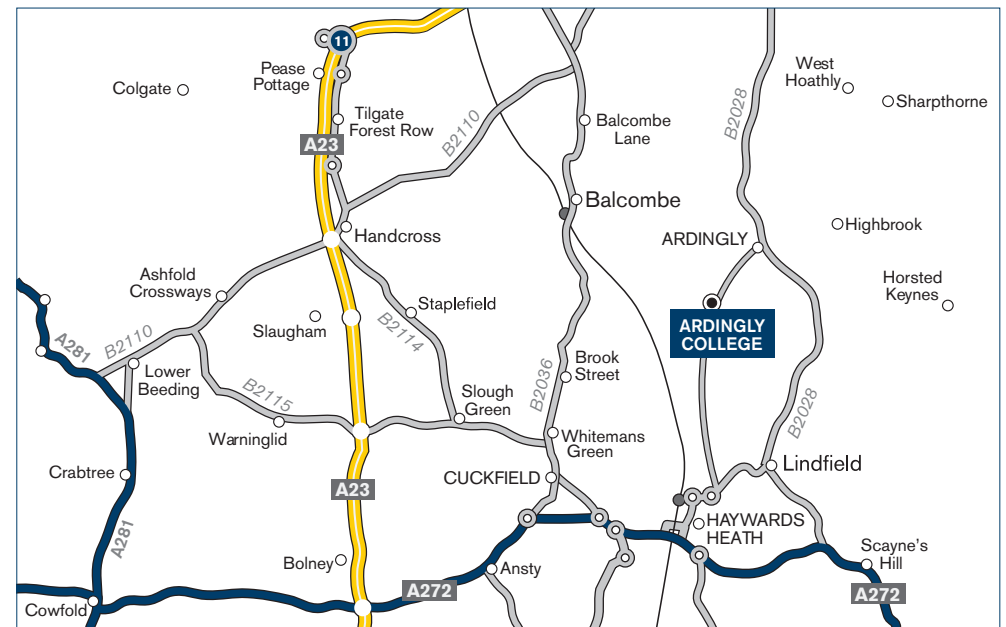
Join the southbound M23 and exit at Junction 10. Take the first exit marked East Grinstead A264. Cross straight over the first roundabout and turn right onto the B2028 marked 'South East of England Showground'. Stay on the B2028 until you reach 'Ardingly', drive through the village and turn right on to College Road. You will see the College on your right after approximately 1/2 mile.

From Brighton

Follow the A23 for approximately 12 miles, leaving it at the sign marked Cuckfield and Haywards Heath and join the A272. Remain on the A272 across two roundabouts, bypassing Cuckfield, and then across 3 further roundabouts to Haywards Heath. On entering the one way system take the second turning left onto 'The Broadway' B2028. Travel to the next roundabout and take the fourth exit onto Sydney Road. At the next roundabout take the second exit, still on the B2028 and turn left onto Summerhill Lane. Travel for 2.25 miles and the entrance to the College is on your left.

From the East & West

Take the A272 to Haywards Heath and enter the one way system. Take the second turning left onto 'The Broadway' B2028. Travel to the next roundabout and take the fourth exit onto Sydney Road. At the next roundabout take the second exit, still on the B2028 and turn left onto Summerhill Lane. Travel for 2.25 miles and the entrance to the College is on your left.
