### **Enrichment Programme and Service**

We have over 70 activities on offer and Senior pupils enjoy three enrichment sessions each week where they can choose from activities in the following categories: Outdoor; Sporting; The Arts; Academic and Life Skills, all playing their part in discovering passions and developing individuals.

### **Elite Sports**

Ardingly has a great reputation for sport. We run Elite Football and Hockey programmes. We also develop and support talented boys and girls in all other sporting disciplines.

### **Sports**

In addition, we offer a wide range of other sports, including horse riding, water-sports and fencing.

### **Visual Arts**

Ardingly's Art Department is a vital, energetic centre of creativity. It's an environment where individuality is encouraged and the confidence and freedom to express ideas through a strong base of artistic skill is fostered.

### **Business and Economics Hub**

Our Business and Economics Centre is a hub of energy, positivity and excellence. We offer A Level, IB and BTEC in Business and A Level and IB in the subject of Economics.  
The Business and Economics experience at Ardingly College encompasses modern teaching with real-life business and economic case studies.

### **Music**

Our Music School, with its selection of choirs, orchestras and ensembles, provides on-site tuition for almost any instrument. Catering for the classical to the contemporary musician, our young and dynamic team fuel and further musical passions.

### **Learning Support**

At Ardingly College we understand that some of our students may need a little more time and support to get to their desired destination, whether that is building more organisational skills for school life, or using focused Learning Support provision to achieve their academic potential.

### The Curriculum

All students are taught by subject specialist staff in their own designated suite of classrooms. Students at all stages are encouraged to follow a curriculum which can be broad though ultimately leading to successful outcomes by focusing on strengths and passions.

### Homework

Students in Shell, Remove and Fifth are set between 45 and 60 minutes' homework in two subjects each weekday evening. For boarders, Evening School runs between 18.30 and 20.45, Monday to Friday, and is supervised by House Tutors. Day pupils may remain at College to complete their work, either in House or the Library. Remove and Fifth Form students also have some timetabled supervised study periods (SSPs).

### Examinations

Students sit examinations in every subject during the Trinity term of Remove, mock examinations are held in the first half of the Lent term in Fifth and students are continually assessed throughout the year. External written coursework is also completed in some subjects.

### Personal Education

All Middle School students follow a comprehensive PSHE programme and Sixth Form have off-timetable days for PSHE and important events such as "Safe Drive, Stay Alive". In addition to educating our students, we hold parent information evenings on a range of topics from drug and alcohol abuse to sexual relationships, and from cyber-safety to talking to teenagers.

It is important to prepare students for life beyond Ardingly so that they can take their place in the world with confidence and independence. As part of their enrichment programme, they have the opportunity to learn life skills, and in the final week of term attend a week of talks and workshops to prepare them to be 'World Ready'.

## Student Council

Students have a say in how their school is run. The Student Council is a forum to discuss issues affecting the student body.

A team of Sixth Form IT Ambassadors lead the way in educating parents, staff and students on how to stay safe online.

A Peer Support team provides a listening service to help students talk through their problems and find their own solutions.

## Catering

The Catering Department is committed to providing an exciting range of healthy and nutritious menus. The food that is offered gives students a choice of freshly produced meals, providing a healthy and balanced diet, exceeding current government guidelines for school meals. Using the best quality, fresh ingredients, the team of chefs continually review the menus to develop and include new and exciting dishes.

The Catering team work actively with all suppliers to ensure the ingredients used are reduced in salt, sugar, fat and, wherever possible, sourced locally with full traceability. All of our suppliers are local to the College and located within an 80 mile radius of the campus. They take great care and are sensitive to individual requests, be it religious, ethical, or dietary requirements. They actively respond to feedback that they may receive regarding food or service through talking to students, feedback surveys, and comments through the student Food Committee meetings.

The College scores on the doors is currently 5 out of 5 and the Catering team hold a gold award in the local health authorities' "eat out eat well" scheme. We were the first school to do so in Mid Sussex.

We are delighted that 78% of all disposable items used within the department are either compostable or recyclable. No plastic bottles of water, we don't use plastic bottles of water and the College also uses recyclable tetra packs.

## ADMISSIONS

There are five year groups in the Senior School.

Year 9 or 'Shell'	(age 13 - 14)
Year 10 or 'Remove'	(age 14 - 15)
Fifth Form	(age 15 - 16)
Lower Sixth	(age 16 - 17)
Upper Sixth	(age 17 - 18)

Admission into the Senior School is normally at age 13 into Year 9 or age 16 into the Lower Sixth Form. Students may also gain entry into Year 10, the Fifth Form and occasionally the Upper Sixth, if suitable and subject to places being available.

Admission into Year 9 has four parts: an academic pre-test, a meeting with the Headmaster or a senior teacher and the admissions personnel, a school reference and school report. The purpose of these elements is to ensure that we can support every pupil to achieve their academic potential, and that there is a good match between a child's interests and abilities and the opportunities we offer at Ardingly College.

Candidates for 2021+ entry will be asked to sit the ISEB Common Pre-test in Year 6. The Common pre-test is used by many senior schools and welcomed by prep schools and parents, as it requires only one sitting. Parents and children are therefore spared the stress of sitting multiple assessments at different schools. The test is online and is taken at their prep school.

Pupils who are not studying for Common Entrance at a prep school either in the UK or abroad are invited to visit the College to meet the Headmaster and/or senior staff and to sit an entrance assessment.

Admission into Year 10 or the Fifth Form is via written assessments in English, Mathematics and Science, and an interview with the Headmaster and/or senior staff. We also require a report and reference from the pupil's previous school.

Admission into the Sixth Form is via written assessments in English, Mathematics and Verbal Reasoning. Candidates will be invited to attend an entrance assessment in November for entry the following September. We require a report and reference from the pupil's previous school. Entry is also subject to the candidate gaining six or more grade 6 passes at GCSE and at least a 5 in both English Language and Mathematics. If the candidate is not sitting GCSEs in his/her current school, an offer of a place will be based on the assessments, report, interview and predicted grades.

## VISITING ARDINGLY COLLEGE

### Open Mornings

Our Open Mornings provide an opportunity to hear from the Headmaster, meet our teachers and tour the school. During the morning our students bring Ardingly College alive, demonstrating activities from our Enrichment Programme. Our artists, scientists, actors, sports boys and girls and musicians seize the opportunity to showcase their particular passion.

We also invite visitors to attend a carousel of short talks which will give an insight into an Ardingly College education and provide further information about the admissions process, followed by a personalised student tour.

In addition to the above mentioned scholarships, there is also an Ashdown Leadership Award, which is for candidates who, though not quite strong enough to win an academic award outright, show outstanding all-round ability.

Scholarships and awards are offered on the basis of examinations and interviews held at the College. Non-academic scholarships take place in the Lent term of Year 8 with the ISEB Academic scholarships in the Summer term. All applicants must be registered and deposited with the College to apply for any of our scholarships.

Music scholarships and choral exhibitions are offered on the basis of auditions and interviews held at the College in the Lent term. It is strongly suggested that prospective music scholars arrange a preliminary audition with the Director of Music during the Lent term of Year 7 to gauge suitability for such an award. It must be noted that this pre-audition will have no bearing on subsequent auditions at 13+.

## FEES (SEPTEMBER 2018)

### Registration Fee

To register your child at Ardingly College, a registration fee of £150 is required. Please note that this fee is non-refundable.

### Confirmation of entry deposit

Once offered, a place cannot be secured until we are in receipt of the confirmation of entry deposit of £1,000.

The deposit applies on joining the College.

For parents resident abroad, the deposit will be one term's fees.

In accordance with the Terms & Conditions signed when accepting a place, parents must give a full term's notice in writing to the Headmaster before withdrawing a pupil from the College, changing status from boarding to day, or ceasing music or other individual lessons, or a term's fees must be paid in lieu.

Please note that if a child has been in boarding in the College for the Michaelmas and Lent terms, the Trinity term fee which will apply to that child, irrespective of whether he or she boards or transfers to a day pupil, will be the same boarding fee as for the prior two terms.

### Sibling Discount

Where there are siblings in various year groups across the College, siblings discounts will be applied as follows:

Three children: 5% discount will be awarded to the youngest child.

Four children: 15% discount will be awarded to the youngest child, 5% discount will be awarded to the second youngest child.

## INSURANCE

The College provides a number of insurance schemes to cover costs in certain eventualities:

### Personal Accident Insurance

The College provides insurance that offers comprehensive worldwide cover during the term and holiday periods, and includes emergency dentistry as result of an injury. This is included in the normal tuition fee.

In addition the College offers a variety of insurance cover at competitive rates. Details of these schemes are sent to parents of pupils before entry, or can be obtained by emailing: [insurances@ardingly.com](mailto:insurances@ardingly.com).

### Reimbursement of School Fees

Insurance that provides reimbursement of fees in case of absence from school through illness. The school cannot grant remission to those parents who do not opt to join this insurance scheme. (Currently charged at 0.89% fees.)

### AXA PPP Pupils' Healthcare Scheme

In addition to in-patient and day-patient benefits, specialist consultations, scans, surgery, mental health treatment, cancer cover and fast track appointments, this covers students for a combined overall maximum of ten physio sessions per year, when referred by their GP, with no yearly limit on fees. (Currently charged at £75 per term.)

### Personal Belongings

Due to the wide variety and value of personal belongings that students bring to and from College on a regular basis, the College is unable to provide insurance for personal belongings.

Parents should therefore ensure that adequate insurance is arranged to cover all the personal belongings of their children. For UK parents, in most cases, this can be provided as an addition to a normal Household Effects insurance policy.

## PAYMENT OF FEES

**Each term's fees are charged separately and the fees payable in respect of each term fall due for payment by you on the first day of that term.**

We may not allow your child to attend the school if you do not pay on time.

The fees will be reviewed during the course of your child's education (usually annually) and may be increased. Notice of an increase in the fees will be sent to you before the end of the penultimate term before the increase is to take effect. This will allow you time to consider the increase and, if you wish to withdraw your child from the school before the proposed increase is set to take effect, then you will have sufficient time to provide the required term's notice of withdrawal to the school.

We regret we cannot accept payment in currencies other than GBP. To avoid possible losses caused by variations in the rate of exchange, cheques and transfers must be made in GBP. Please note that the College will not be responsible for bank charges incurred in the transfer of fees. Where these are not paid at the time of issue, they will be deducted from the deposit at the end of the student's course. We regret we cannot accept Euro-cheques.

In accordance with the Parent Contract, signed by all parents, the College reserves the right to levy a late payment charge on the overdue amount at the rate of 3% a year above the base rate. Unless we tell you otherwise in writing, this interest will accrue on a daily basis from the due date until the date of actual payment of the overdue amount, a notice to this effect is also printed on the fees invoice. In addition a pupil may be excluded from the College at any time when fees are unpaid, and will be deemed withdrawn without notice 28 days after exclusion.

Payment can be made by the following methods:

### Direct Debit

The instruction you sign authorises payment to the College.

You will be notified of the amounts and dates on which the money is to be taken (UK bank accounts only.)

These are collected in three monthly instalments each term being 40%, 30% and 30% of the term's invoice.

### Credit or Debit card

Please note that due to card charges, the College no longer accepts payment by credit / debit cards inc. American Express (rates chargeable for credit cards.)

### Sterling Cheques

Please make cheques payable to Ardingly College Ltd. (NB. It is expected that payment by cheque will begin to be phased out by 2020 and replaced with bank transfer arrangements.)

### Advice for parents - Cyber Fraud

WARNING - Cyber fraud is a very real concern and therefore there will be regular notices to parents in the newsletters and by email to ensure they are made aware that no changes will be made to bank accounts at short notice.

- Always verify an email payment change request directly with the College, via the official, established contact details you have or have obtained from a trusted source e.g. College website. Be alert to unexpected or increased fee requests.
- Be vigilant and always scrutinise requests to amend payment instructions. Check for inconsistencies and grammatical errors in emails, such as a misspelt College name or a slightly different email address; these can be warning signs of fraud.
- Verify details with the College if being asked to make fee payments into a new bank account.
- If you have any concerns at any time in relation to a communication received about fees, please call the Finance team on 01444 893024.

### Parents Resident abroad

From time to time, some parents that reside abroad do not have access to guaranteed funds in a UK bank account and therefore have experienced serious difficulty in overcoming currency control restrictions in respect of the payment of fees. For this reason they have been unable to comply with the College's requirement that fees must be paid on or before the start of each term. Therefore, where it is deemed that these circumstances may apply, an increased deposit will be required equivalent of one term's fees.

These fees will be held on account and used to offset the final term's fees.

We strongly recommend that parents transferring money from overseas accounts do so by electronic bank transfer rather than by sending a cheque. Bank charges to process a cheque are very expensive and we will only credit your account with the GBP amount actually received after charges. The cheapest and most convenient method of paying fees (and the deposit) is by direct bank transfer.

## BUS ROUTES

The College operates a number of bus services which serve only Ardingly College students. As well as providing a convenient service for parents, the College is committed to reducing the number of vehicles on campus, reducing its carbon footprint and pursuing a sustainable approach to travel. We also wish to address the inherent safety risk from moving traffic, particularly during the busy morning drop-off and afternoon pick-up times.



## HOW TO FIND US

### By Air

London Gatwick Airport is ten miles away. Heathrow, Luton and Stanstead airports are also within easy reach via the M25 and M23.

### By Rail

The nearest mainline station is Haywards Heath (on the London to Brighton railway line) which is a ten-minute taxi journey from Ardingly.

### By Road

Ardingly College is located between Crawley and Haywards Heath, close to the M23, A23 and A272, just 35 miles south of London and 20 miles north of Brighton, making it easily accessible via the UK road network.

### From London



Join the southbound M23 and exit at Junction 10. Take the first exit marked East Grinstead A264. Cross straight over the first roundabout and turn right onto the B2028 marked 'South East of England Showground'. Stay on the B2028 until you reach 'Ardingly', drive through the village and turn right on to College Road. You will see the College on your right after approximately ½ mile.

### From Brighton

Follow the A23 for approximately 12 miles, leaving it at the sign marked Cuckfield and Haywards Heath and join the A272. Remain on the A272 across two roundabouts, bypassing Cuckfield, and then across three further roundabouts to Haywards Heath. On entering the one-way system take the second turning left onto 'The Broadway' B2028. Travel to the next roundabout and take the fourth exit onto Sydney Road. At the next roundabout take the second exit, still on the B2028, and turn left onto Summerhill Lane. Travel for 2.25 miles and the entrance to the College is on your left.

### From the East & West

Take the A272 to Haywards Heath and enter the one-way system. Take the second turning left onto 'The Broadway' B2028. Travel to the next roundabout and take the fourth exit onto Sydney Road. At the next roundabout take the second exit, still on the B2028, and turn left onto Summerhill Lane. Travel for 2.25 miles and the entrance to the College is on your left.
