

Supporting Pupil Premium Students 2018-19

Pupil Premium funding has been allocated to schools so that they can address the achievement gap between pupils who are eligible for Pupil Premium and those who are not. Ofsted and the Department for Education make it clear that schools can use the Pupil Premium in any way they think is effective, as long as the attainment gap is closing. Ashlawn School spends it on a balance of academic, pastoral and enrichment activities. The school is charged with allocating this money to maximise pupil achievement.

Nature of support 2018/2019

At Ashlawn School we believe in quality first teaching for all students regardless of background. Interventions will happen for key students based on particular need.

A Learning Coordinator in charge of Pupil Premium will work across the school to support students, ensure that they can access the curriculum and remove barriers to their engagement, attendance and hence their progress.

Maths and English Graduates will be working with targeted students in small groups to improve the literacy and numeracy skills and assist them to make at least expected progress. Some students will also receive after school tuition in English and/or Maths to support them if there is a further need.

There is a dedicated Pupil Premium Champion in each of the English, Maths, Science, MFL and Humanities teams who is responsible for supporting Pupil Premium students in these areas and ensuring that they have all they need to be successful.

Learning mentors will work with key students to help them to build their confidence and self esteem and guide staff in ensuring that the students are safe, happy, confident and successful.

Sixth form students will support PP students in a variety of subjects where we are able to partner them up. The older students will act as mentors to the younger students and assist them with developing good study habits and improving their subject knowledge.

Teaching Assistants will be allocated to support students where there is a particular need. Revision guides and additional support materials will be bought for students where necessary. Financial support will help students to access educational visits and to buy important equipment and materials to support their learning. A variety of tailored pastoral support will be allocated by need, such as individual learning mentors, early careers service advice, EIS and attendance monitoring and targets.
