This scheme is available to Year 12 students who attend a non-selective state school, and who meet one or more of the following criteria:

- have a disability
- are a young carer
- are a forced migrant (e.g. refugee or asylum seeker)
- are estranged from parent(s)
- currently live or have lived in local authority care

There is no set date for the programme as students will be considered on a rolling basis.
