Who is Jesus?

In this unit, children will learn that Jesus made statements about himself, describing himself through symbolism. They will learn how the statements relate to the personal lives of Christians and will be encouraged to consider how the meanings behind Jesus' statements are relevant in their lives.

Writing: Children will be:

- Writing a recount in the form of a newspaper article.
- Writing structured poetry through composing ballads.

Reading: Children will be preparing poems to read aloud and to perform, showing understanding through intonation, tone, volume and action. Considering historical details in stories.

THEME

Theme name: Hail Caesar!

Subject Driver: History

In this theme, in **History** children will be learning about life in Celtic and Roman times. They will look at key events during the Roman period and research aspects of Roman and Celtic life. The children will analyse the impact of the Roman invasion on Britain and use a range of sources to find out information. They will learn about Boudicca and the main events of Boudicca's revolt. In **Geography** children will study and map the Roman invasion.

In **Art** they will design and make their own Roman shield and mosaic. In **DT** they will design and make a chariot. In **Science** children will learn about forces and friction, which will be related to work on Roman chariots. In **Music**, the children will be listening to music from the film Gladiator and analysing how the music gives the impression of moods. Then they will be composing their own pieces titled 'Roman Invasion'.
