It was lovely to see so many of you this week at our Parent Interviews and I hope you found them useful and informative. Please don't forget that you are welcome to make an appointment to see your child's class teacher at any time if you have any concerns you would like to discuss with them. Our spring term Parent Interview dates are provisionally set for the 30<sup>th</sup> and 31<sup>st</sup> of January when we will share with you the latest assessment information we have for the children, giving you some clear targets to help your child progress and improve.

Next week is our annual Wellbeing Week and we have a range of activities for the children to take part in. We are very grateful to the School Association who are helping to fund the "Art of Being Brilliant" workshops on Wednesday. We are though relying on yourselves to help part fund some of the other workshops and activities we have planned, so if you haven't sent in your £1 (Year R/Year 1/Year 2) and your £2 (Year 3/Year 4/Year 5/Year 6), then please do so as quickly as possible. We want to encourage safe cycling, so please support us with this.

### HAVE YOUR SAY

Have your say on plans to introduce a borough-wide 20mph limit in Richmond upon Thames! Earlier this year the Council announced its intention to reduce the speed limit on all roads (except the A316 and A205 which are under Transport for London red-route control) to 20mph.

The speed limit would not only reduce vehicle speeds on our roads but evidence shows that it should reduce the number and severity of road accidents. This would make our roads safer for children and families walking or cycling to and from school/nursery each day.
