Learning Opportunities

£469

We have paid for children to access learning opportunities outside of the school day.

Impact: These enrichment activities consolidate and complement the learning and social opportunities that take place as part of the school day.

The Pupil Premium is additional funding for publicly funded schools in England. This funding helps to raise the attainment of disadvantaged pupils of all abilities and to close the gaps between them and their peers. **We have Pupil Premium children across the whole school.**

Support Staffing costs

£31,644

A proportion of our support staff salaries are paid from this funding allocation. These include costs to cover 1:1 support and interventions.

Impact: These TAs aid our Pupil Premium children through 1:1 support. They also help the children by working in small group situations and providing in class support to the other children, enabling the class teacher to work with their Pupil Premium children. Funding also goes towards our Learning Mentor who is a key figure in these children's lives.

School Trips and Residential

£1600



We have paid for children to access learning opportunities as part of School trips and residentials.

Impact: These are key to our Pupil Premium children as it gives them enrichment opportunities which they wouldn't experience outside of school. They are invaluable as these often relate to their learning in class and other follow up tasks to complete.

Lego Therapy

£55



We have paid for resources linked to Lego Therapy for our Pupil Premium children.

Impact: These children can fully engage in Lego Therapy sessions at School and then follow up activities at home, leading on from work done in the classroom setting.

Maths Resources

£24



We have bought some maths resources to enable our children to practise work done in class, at home.

Impact: A number of our children have been provided with resources so that they can continue their learning, begun in school, at home. This enables them to practise skills and strategies taught in class and narrow gaps which they have in learning.



Funding - Financial Year 2016 to 2017

In the 2016 to 2017 financial year, schools will receive the following funding for each child registered as eligible for Pupil Premium at any point in the last 6 years:

£1,320 for pupils in Reception to Year 6
