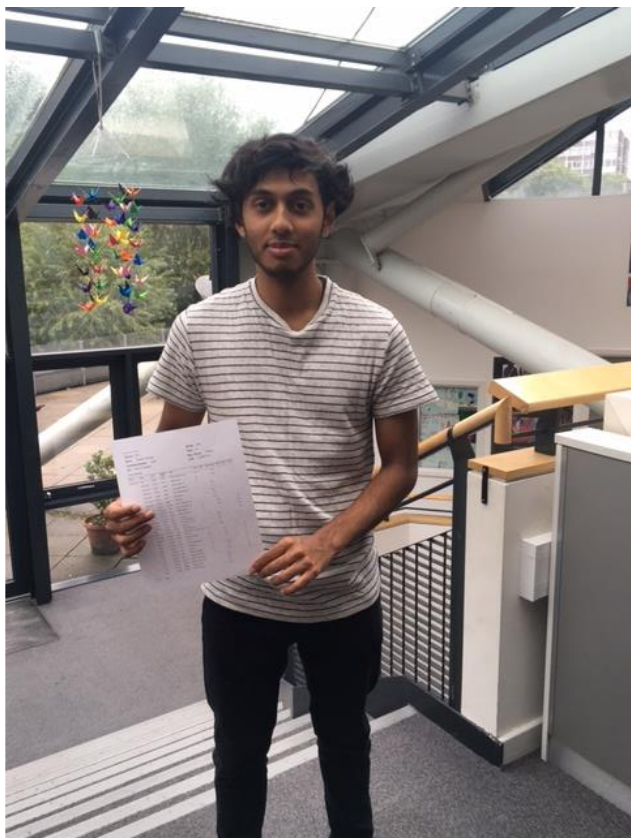

Year 13 Attainment Summer 2017

Well done to our Year 13 students who have achieved our best results so far, making significant improvements from the previous year.

- 64% A*-B including BTEC (52.5%)
- 98% A*-E including BTEC (97%)
- 56% A*-B not including BTEC (44%)
- 97% A*-E not including BTEC (94%)
- 79% A*-C including BTEC (72.6%)

- The average grade that students achieve at A Level is C+
- The average grade that students achieve in vocational qualifications is a Distinction+

Year 13 Destinations: University

- 91% of students have accepted university places.
- 19% have taken places at Russell Group universities.
- 44% of University places are with top 3rd of Universities as defined by the DfE including.

Progress in English and Mathematics GCSE Re-sits

- 67% of students re-sitting English GCSE in Sixth Form Achieved a C grade or above (compared to 34% which is the Hackney average).
- 25% of students re-sitting Mathematics GCSE in Sixth Form Achieved a C grade or above (compared to 22% which is the Hackney average).

Students' Progress and Average Grades

A Levels

- Progress for A Levels is +0.12
- The average grade for A Levels is C+

Vocational Qualifications

- Progress for Vocational Qualifications is +1.18
- The average grade for Vocational Qualifications is Distinction+

Retention Rates – Published March 2017 by the Department for Education

- A Level: 92% of students with A Level core aims were retained
- Academic: 92% of students with Academic core aims were retained.
- Vocational: 100% of students with vocational core aims were retained.
