Overview of Sports Premium

The PE and sport premium is designed to help primary providers improve the quality of the PE and sport activities they offer their pupils. Schools must spend the funding to improve the quality of the PE and sport activities they offer their pupils, but they are free to choose the best way of using the money. For example, funding can be used to:

- hire specialist PE teachers
- hire qualified sports coaches to work with teachers
- provide existing staff with teaching resources to help them teach PE and sport
- support and involve the least active children by running or extending school sports clubs, holiday clubs and Change4Life clubs
- run sport competitions or increase pupils' participation in the School Games
- run sports activities with other schools

Since September 2013, Ofsted inspections report on how primary schools spend their PE and sport premium funding.

One lunchtime for year 5 and one for year 6 each week are used to train sports leaders who then lead activities for other children in KS2. There are 14 in year 5 and 14 in year 6. From 20.3.16 pupils are signed up for specific roles as part of the restructure of lunchtime activities.</p> <p>28 pupils – impact on whole of KS2</p>

Pupils are allocated on rotation so that all pupils get the opportunity to attend throughout the school year.</p> <p>61 pupils</p>

Initial concerns around suitability for students have been addressed and students record positive scores for enjoyment.
