Overview of Sports Premium

The PE and sport premium is designed to help primary providers improve the quality of the PE and sport activities they offer their pupils. Schools must spend the funding to improve the quality of the PE and sport activities they offer their pupils, but they are free to choose the best way of using the money. For example, funding can be used to:

- hire specialist PE teachers
- hire qualified sports coaches to work with teachers
- provide existing staff with teaching resources to help them teach PE and sport
- support and involve the least active children by running or extending school sports clubs, holiday clubs and Change4Life clubs
- run sport competitions or increase pupils' participation in the School Games
- run sports activities with other schools

Since September 2013, Ofsted inspections report on how primary schools spend their PE and sport premium funding.



Action plan including breakdown of planned expenditure

Short term aim – To provide 100% of pupils with taster sessions and club links in a sport or activity they have never tried.

Long term aim (3 years) – To have 100% of pupils accessing regular extra physical activity, whether in school or out of school.

Swimming gala entered with 16 pupils. 1 team entered into the local gymnastics tumbling competition and training took place twice a week at lunchtimes (15 pupils at training). Indoor athletics team entered local event (21 pupils). In the summer term there will be teams entered into quad kids events, rounders and cricket matches.

Our Sports leaders and sports prefects will support the adults to run events.
