

## Privacy policy

This privacy statement discloses the privacy practices for The Bury Grammar Schools. It applies solely to this website; links within this site to other websites are not covered by this privacy statement.

### Information collection and use

This website does not store or collect any personal information about site users. The system will record your email address and other information if volunteered to us by you through certain sections of the site, such as requesting a prospectus. This information shall be treated as confidential. It may only be used for internal purposes and to contact you following a request for information.

### Cookies

A cookie is a small file, which asks permission to be placed on your computer's hard drive. Once you agree, the file is added and the cookie helps analyse web traffic or lets you know when you visit a particular site. Cookies allow web applications to respond to you as an individual. The web application can tailor its operations to your needs, likes and dislikes by gathering and remembering information about your preferences. In general, we use cookies and our records of the pages users have visited to gather information about all of our users collectively, such as what areas users visit most frequently and what services are accessed most. We only use such data in the aggregate. This information helps us determine what is most beneficial for our users, and how we can continually create a better overall experience for our users and improve our website in order to tailor it to customer needs. Overall, cookies help us provide you with a better website, by enabling us to monitor which pages you find useful and which you do not. A cookie in no way gives us access to your computer or any information about you, other than the data you choose to share with us.

The table below explains the cookies we use and why.

Google Analytics	_utma _utmb _utmc _utmz	These cookies are used to collect information about how visitors use our site. We use the information to compile reports and to help us improve the site. - Click on 'Windows Explorer'
- Click on 'Tools'
- Click on 'Internet Options'
- Click on the 'General' tab
- Click on the 'Delete' button in the 'Browsing History' section
- Click on the 'Delete Cookies' button next to the 'Cookies' section
- Close when finished
- Click on the 'Ok' button to close
