

A 100% pass rate for the girls at Coloma Convent

Coloma Convent Girls' School in Croydon has once again achieved outstanding A level results this year, with an overall pass rate of 100% – including 32% of those grades at A* or A.

Coloma offers a wide range of over 30 A Level courses and the results across these and also the Extended Project, have been exceptional.

In summary, 67% of all grades achieved were A* – B and over 90% were A* – C.

A special mention should be given to the first-rate performances of Caroline Wroblewska, Isabel Oliver, Sarah Limb and Elizabeth Cole, each of whom achieved two or more A* grades at A level.

A total of 25 individual students achieved at least one A* grade with 12 achieving three or more A* – A grades.

Over 90% of Coloma girls are celebrating gaining places at their chosen universities and will go on to study a variety of courses.

They range from Chemical Engineering and Computer Games Programming to Architecture and Medicine.

The Sixth Form Students at Coloma have combined their studies with a broad range of extra-curricular activities and service to the community.
