## Students achieve record **A-level and Btec results**

Sixth form colleges across the borough announced record high A-level results this year.

Private and state schools in Croydon were celebrating after the borough's teenagers scored almost 100 per cent passes at both A-level and Btec qualifications on Thursday.

Private schools Trinity, Croydon High School and Old Palace set new records for the numbers of pupils achieving top grades.

At Trinity 64.2 per cent of the grades awarded were A or A\*s and 91.2 per cent were A\* to B.

Croydon High School achieved 86 per cent A\* to B, Old Palace 89 per cent A\* to Cs and Royal Russell School 92 per cent A\* to C.

State funded school kept pace with their paid-for rivals scoring top results in both A-level and Btec qualifications.
Thomas More Catholic

School achieved a 98 per cent pass rate at A-level - 16 per cent of the results were A\* or A grade. In total 58 per cent of

all marks were A\* to C grades.
Archbishop Tenison pupils achieved a 98.3 per cent pass rate in their A-levels.

The school scored 65.4 per

cent A\* to C grades At Coloma Convent Girls' School 10 per cent of all grades were A\*s, 32 per cent were A\* or As and 87 per cent were A\*s to Cs. while at John Ruskin there was a 98.4 per cent pass rate in this year's Btec qualifications, which are equivalent to three A-levels.

Pupis at the Harris Federation, which includes sixth-form colleges in Purley, South Norwood and Crystal Palace, got an average score of 752, equivalent to two As and a B.

Students at Croydon College notched up a 93 per cent Alevel pass rate and pupils at Coulsdon Sixth Form College registered a 100 per cent pass rate for its Btec entrants, and 93 per cent pass rate for its Alevel students.

On Thursday, August 23, GCSE students across Croydon will hope to emulate their older colleagues
