Dear Parents & Carers,

Year 10 mock examinations run from 1st – 8th March. I wish to provide you with the salient details in order that you are able to fully support both your child and the College. I will deliver an expanded version of these details to the year group via assembly.

The purpose of the examinations is to provide both students and teachers alike with information regarding students' current understanding as well as gaps in their knowledge. Furthermore, it is the mock examinations that inform teachers regarding setting for Year 11. It is, therefore, imperative that students take the mock examinations very seriously both in terms of their preparation and conduct. Personalised timetables will be provided to ensure that all students know what is happening and when. Please ask your child to share this information with you so you can firstly monitor their revision and, secondly, ensure they leave home with extra time to spare for morning examinations. As per examination regulations, students must write in black biro and store all equipment in a transparent pencil case. Regarding electronic devices, in particular mobile phones, these must not be in the possession of the student nor inside the examination room. All such items must be handed in prior to the exam where they will be kept securely. It may be easier to leave these items at home when examinations are taking place.


