CAMROSE CENTRE DONATIONS

The Camrose Centre is a drop-in centre primarily aimed to help homeless and vulnerable people in Basingstoke, providing breakfast and hot lunches, table tennis & games, and offering advice on a variety of topics including housing, employment, drugs & alcohol issues, and training.

At this time of year the need for help is great and the centre quickly runs out of provisions. In particular, the centre is looking for donations of the following: jeans sized 28-34, medium size boxer shorts, socks, toiletries, towels, sleeping bags and thermal mugs/flasks. They are also in need of pot noodles, high energy cereal bars, crisps, bottled water, ring pull cans of beans and sausages, soup, fish and meat. These food donations they will ensure that people who sleep rough have something to keep the cold out and give them energy to survive too.

Staff at CBEC have already started donating but if you would like to help, please bring your donations to Cranbourne. Miss Young is coordinating the collection and she will be delivering the donations just before Christmas.
