Residents of Burford close have been advised by London Borough of Redbridge's traffic control to take photographs of cars parked inappropriately, including number plates, and send them to traffic control where fines will be issued where needed. Please do try to park considerately. Whenever you park close to the school please consider whether an emergency vehicle can get through and prams/buggies can use the pavement, if not you are putting children's lives at risk.
