## INTERNET SAFETY TIP SNAPCHAT: HOW DO I BLOCK AND DELETE?



### Blocking and Deleting friends

Blocking someone on Snapchat means they will be prevented from sending you Snaps, Chats or viewing your Stories. Deleting someone means they will no longer show up on your friends list, but your privacy settings determine whether or not they can still see your Snaps. To block or delete a contact:

- Tap the username you want to block or delete in your **'My Friends'** page.
- Tap the gear icon that appears next to their name.
- Select **'Block'** to prevent Snaps, Chats or from them viewing your Stories.
- Select **'Remove Friend'** to remove them from your friends list.
- To block someone who isn't in your friends list, just swipe on their name on the Chat screen to open a Chat with them. Then tap the button in the top left corner to access their profile, where you can block them.

To unblock a user:

- Tap the ghost at the top of the Camera screen. Then tap the gear icon and scroll down to **'Account Actions'** and tap **'Blocked.'** You should see a list of Snapchatters who are currently blocked by you. Tap the X next to their name to unblock them.
- Depending on your privacy settings you may need to re-add each other as friends to send Snaps and Chats back and forth.

The Commonwealth celebrates 53 countries and many various dignitaries from many other countries had flown in from all around the world. Wealthy people arrived in chauffeur driven cars with customised number plates and tinted windows. Outside of the Houses of Parliament were the flags of the Commonwealth countries, and there were statues of people who had made a difference in society.

## The 10 Commandments

The 10 Commandments are God's 10 laws of love to keep us safe so we can all live in peace, putting God first and respecting one another.

God blesses those who obey him and so remain in his protection. God keeps his promises.

At our baptism, promises were made to reject Satan and to follow Jesus, keeping God's Commandments of love.

The Lord said,

1. I am the Lord your God:

you shall not have strange gods before me.

(God must be more important to us than anything else because he is the source of life and has a wonderful plan for your life. Trust in him, not fortune-tellers and the like.)



2. You shall not take the name of the Lord your God in vain.

(Do not misuse God's holy name.

Switch off the T.V. if you hear it being misused.) If we hear it, we could say "bless your holy name" 3 times to repay God with honour and respect.

7. You shall not steal.

(Do not take or damage any property which does not belong to you or borrow anything without permission.)

8. You shall not bear false witness against your neighbour.

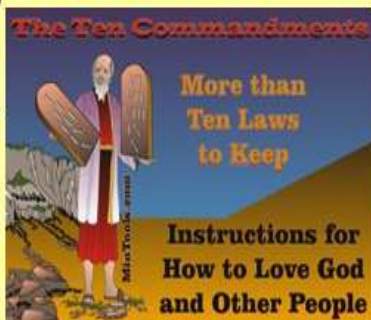
(Do not tell lies or spread false rumours about anyone or put the blame on someone else.)

9. You shall not covet your neighbour's wife.

(Do not desire to take someone else's husband or wife. Do not set your heart on them.)

10. You shall not covet your neighbour's goods.

(Do not desire or set your heart on things which belong to someone else.)



3. Remember to keep holy the Lord's day. (Jesus longs for us who have made our First Holy Communion, to receive him in the Eucharist at Mass every Sunday or Saturday evening as a top priority, before going to worship with our friends at different churches.

Mass is the highest form of Christian worship because Jesus said "Do this in memory of me."

4. Honour your Father and your mother.

(Obey and show great respect to your parents and those in charge of you.)



5. You shall not kill.

(Do not destroy a person's body, reputation, or feelings hurtful actions, hurtful words or by ignoring them or being uncaring. Do not neglect to help the poor, homeless or weak. Pope Francis says to fast from gossip.)



6. You shall not commit adultery.

(Be faithful in marriage.

Keep your promises.)



When we break God's commandments of love we sin, turning our back on God and his protection. God's chosen people, the Israelites walked into all kinds of dangers and wars when they disobeyed God.



But God is our loving Heavenly Father who longs for us to come back to him, will always forgive us, if we are truly sorry and turn to him.

In the Sacrament of Reconciliation we receive Forgiveness, Healing and Peace.

**Examination of Conscience:** Each night, we need to look back over the day and ask God's forgiveness for our sins; for any unkind thoughts, and the things we wish we hadn't said or done, and the good things that we failed to do.

**Prayer:** Lord Jesus Christ, Son of the Living God, have mercy on me a sinner and on the whole world. Help me to be as merciful to others as you are to me. We ask this in Jesus' name. Amen.
