Outstanding A-Level Results

The Highcrest Academy is celebrating some of the best ever A-level results in its history.

Despite significant national changes to the A level Examination system, students at The Highcrest Academy Sixth Form have achieved exceptional results again this year.

100% of students passed their A Level examinations, with 20% achieving the top A*-A grades, 50% achieving A*-B grades and an incredible 88% gaining A*-C grades (National figure 77.4%!).

In addition, the outcomes for our A level equivalent BTEC courses are equally notable with 100% of students passing, 93.5% gaining a Merit grade or higher and 71% gaining a Distinction* or Distinction.

Some individual successes include, Lamar Edwards who achieved 2 A* grades in Psychology and Sociology and an A grade in Religious Studies. Nafeesa Jehangir achieved 2 A grades in Psychology and Sociology and a B grade in English. Shahryar Khan achieved 2 A grades in Sociology and History and a B grade in Maths. Ritzy Nanda achieved an A* EPQ, an A grade in Economics, a B grade in Maths and a C grade in Further Maths. Whilst Nathan Stanley achieved 4 A levels, with 2 A grades in Maths and Physics and 2 B grades in Chemistry and Further Maths.

Delighted Principal Glen Burke said, "It's been another fantastic year of A-level results. I am very proud of the students and this is reward for the tremendous amount of hard work they have put in. We wish them every success in their future endeavours. These excellent results also reflect the dedication and commitment of our staff and governors and I thank them for their efforts".
