

Sport Premium Funding at Honeywell Infant School

Physical Education continues to play a very important part in the life of Honeywell Infant school and at least two hour long sessions per week are dedicated to physical activity in the curriculum. The children also get significant exercise throughout the day during playtimes and lunchtimes.

We believe that P.E. contributes to the holistic development of children and instils key values such as teamwork, fair play, respect for themselves and others, as well as maintaining a healthy and active lifestyle.

We welcome the Government's announcement to increase the amount of money given to school in the Sports fund to improve the provision of physical education (PE) and sport in primary schools.

We are committed to using this resource in developing **high quality PE lessons**, alongside greater opportunities for sporting activities and clubs for all our young people.

In previous years we have released the previous P.E. lead to work alongside teachers and have developed a designated sports area for the children to use during P.E. lessons and playtimes. We now have a class based P.E. lead so will be using the funding in a different way, developing the teaching of gymnastics and introducing yoga sessions for the younger children.
