



# Kelvin Grove Primary School

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Dear Parents/Carers,

As part of the PSHCE (Personal, Social, Health and Citizenship Education) Curriculum, the children will be taught Relationship and Sex Education at an age-appropriate level, this term.

In Year 2 the children will be taught:

- to recognise there are features common to all humans and important differences that make us male and female
- to recognise we have features in common with other people but particular combinations make us unique; we get these characteristics from our parents
- to understand that as they grow their bodies will change physically
- to explore what people can and cannot do at different ages
- to understand that they are growing and changing and as they grow up they will be able to do new things, like different foods and clothes
- to look at family relationships and relationships beyond the family
- to recognise that feelings and relationships with others also make us unique
- to understand that growth and change belong to the natural life cycle
- to develop the idea that the baby grows in the mother's womb, this growth lasts nine months and is called "pregnancy"
- to learn that as the baby grows in the womb it develops recognisable features and becomes more active
- to encourage children to reflect on themselves as special people and to think about themselves positively in the future
- to discuss appropriate and inappropriate touching
