1: Raise the profile of P.E. and Sport through regular intra competition: *Autumn term every pupil participates in a 20 second speed bounce; Spring term every pupil participates in a 2 minute skip; Summer term every pupil participates in a throwing skill, measuring the distance thrown.*

For every pupil in the school to take part in competition against their peers.

To understand how to win and lose gracefully.

To understand that in order to improve; practice, repetition and perseverance is necessary.

To experience the feeling of success.

To experience the fun and excitement that can be achieved through participating in sport.

2: Raise the profile of P.E. and Sport through regular inter competition:

All intra school competition results are collated and compared across the borough by the Sports Coordinator. Primary schools are encouraged to compete in regular sports fixtures with the results collated by Sports Coordinator.

To make the intra school competition into an inter school competition by providing each school with an overall results chart and awarding Bronze, Silver & Gold certificates to the winning schools.

Fixtures:

For schools to increase competition against other schools and therefore increase participation in both boys and girls.

For pupils to experience going to other schools and meeting new people.

To understand how to win and to lose gracefully.

3: Organise regular festivals:

Minimum of 10 festivals per year involving pupils from year 1 through to year 6.

To involve as many pupils as possible in all year groups and gender.

To choose different activities for each festival.

To introduce pupils to secondary schools and to secondary school sports leaders.

To involve local clubs/NGBs to encourage club links.

To keep records of how many pupils and gender participate in every festival.

6: Deliver leadership training workshops for year 6 pupils:

To teach Year 5 or 6 how to be leaders in the playground during the lunch time.

To be able to organise teams.

To implement games.

To look after equipment.

To coach, lead, be responsible and empathise with the younger children.

7: Research external funding agencies:

To inform schools of borough opportunities available.

To forward relevant e mails to the PE coordinator.

To alert schools of free equipment.

To alert schools of CPD opportunities.

To alert schools to bids available to them.

8: Advice on healthy school events:

To offer help with health weeks.

To encourage networking at the termly meeting.

To encourage sharing of good practice at the termly meeting.

To offer time and help during health week.

9: Reports for the school website:

Individual reports and school profiles updates.

A report of every festival e mailed to the school with photos and results to be posted on the school website.

A profile of the school continually updated containing every meeting, contact with pupils, events etc which can be given to the Head Teacher at any time.
