The care and guidance that we provide to students is important to us, and as part of that, every student is ready for the next stage in their education or career. To this end, we have had two induction events for parents and students in Years 7 and 10. In the Sixth Form, we will shortly begin the process of advice, and guidance in assemblies and one to one tutorials on career choices and applications with our Careers Advisor. It is right that at the start of the academic year, we focus on the areas which we wish to enhance over the year. The priorities below have been informed by feedback, consultation meetings and reviews that we have undertaken over the last year. The student is always at the centre of all that we do and a central feature of our mission statement is to motivate our young people to achieve more than they ever thought possible. We also aim to awaken a curiosity and passion for learning so that our students can play a full part as adults in shaping the society of the future. The key priorities are;

- To implement new assessment arrangements and improve data systems, tracking and communications
- To enhance teaching and learning through a personalised coaching programme
- To improve engagement and reduce gaps in progress and attendance between pupil premium and non-pupil premium students
- To ensure that pupils make the best possible start to their secondary education and provide timely Independent Advice and Guidance from KS3 onwards
- Enhancing the ethos of support to promote wellbeing for all year groups targeting vulnerable students in particular
- To review staffing including leadership and professional effectiveness to improve outcomes for all
- To provide effective school to school support and share and learn from best practice to improve overall standards

If parents wish to discuss any of the above areas, they are welcome to raise them at the forthcoming consultation meetings and suggestions or contributions from parents or other members of the community will be most welcome.

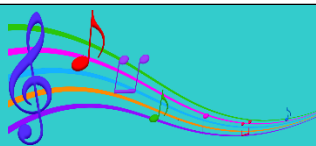

## Morrisby: Careers information

In addition to the careers support we provide in school, we are offering students the chance to take advantage of the Morrisby Online careers tool. This can be a valuable tool in your son's/daughter's future decision making about Sixth Form as well as research into careers and higher education.

It is most appropriate for Year 11s onwards.

Your son/daughter will take an 80 minute online assessment and questionnaire which measure a variety of elements including aptitudes, career interests, work attitudes, talents and motivations. Once the assessment is complete, they will have access to personally tailored career and education suggestions, plus careers-related resources, all presented on an interactive website.

The cost of the subscription to the service is £24.00 per student, which we are asking parents to fund. If you would like your child to take part, please pay by visiting the following page: <https://app.morrisby.com/p6TE2Q>. Once you have paid you will automatically have access to the test.

The system is fully secure and all major debit and credit cards are accepted.

## ALUMNI – Robyn Dowson

I waved goodbye to Kenilworth in August 2010, having achieved A Levels in Psychology, English Literature and Theatre Studies. I was accepted to onto a BSc in Psychology at Cardiff University, my first choice university. I specifically chose a course that included a year in industry, as I wanted to gain relevant experience before I graduated. I completed a year in industry as a Research Assistant within the Cerebra Centre for Neurodevelopmental Disorders at the University of Birmingham in 2013. In my role as a Research Assistant I worked along two PhD students who were researching the behavioural phenotypes of rare neurodevelopmental disorders, such as Fragile X and Cornelia de Lange syndromes. This placement was very rewarding as I got to work closely with families whose lives had been affected by these genetic conditions, and I was able to see how research could significantly benefit children with genetic syndromes, and their families. It was during my placement year that my interest in psychological research first began to take shape, and on returning to Cardiff for my final year I applied to a research Masters programme at the University of Manchester to continue my research training. I graduated from Cardiff University in 2014, with a First Class Honours degree, and was accepted unconditionally onto a Psychology MRes programme.



Having completed my Masters degree with a Distinction, I was accepted onto a PhD programme at the University of Manchester. My PhD is looking to understand the first-hand experiences of people living with dementia when they engage with music. I am working with the Manchester Camerata orchestra, who run innovative music projects for people living with dementia in care homes. I love that my PhD has combined many of my significant interests, including psychology and music, and I was very excited when my PhD work was featured within a Guardian article back in February (<https://www.theguardian.com/social-care-network/2016/feb/29/music-projects-cut-cost-dementia-care>). I am now coming to the end of my first year of my PhD, and I have enjoyed every moment of it so far. I never imagined my path following my time at Kenilworth School would lead to me spending 9 years at university in total; but I have embraced every opportunity that has come my way and this is where it has led me. In the future, I hope to work with people living with dementia in order to enhance their quality of life through the use of creative arts activities.
