The Health Spot (2): The Signs of Sepsis

The NHS have issued guidance for parents on spotting the signs of Sepsis: <http://www.nhs.uk/Conditions/Blood-poisoning/Pages/Introduction.aspx>

Sepsis is a rare but serious complication of an infection. Anyone can get sepsis, but young children are an at risk group. If your child is unwell with a bug or infection, is rapidly getting worse and you are worried that their illness seems different to any previous illness, it could be sepsis.

If they have any of the following symptoms, **go to A&E immediately or call 999:**

- Looks mottled, bluish or pale
- Is very lethargic or difficult to wake
- Feels abnormally cold to touch
- Is breathing very fast
- Has a rash that does not fade when you press it
- Has a fit or convulsion
