Dear Parents and Carers,

It's been a busy couple of weeks at Lawn with Harvest Festival, school photographs, our School Choir busy rehearsal for a very special concert, triathlons, cross country and lots more.

Thank you to the parents and carers that came to our meetings for parents, lots of you thought they were informative. We will be posting the links to some of the things discussed in our homework letters.

We have now have appointed all of our team captains, sports ambassadors, Head Boy and Head Girl and also our School Councillors. They will all be getting busy making great decisions for the school over the next few weeks.

Next Monday is our first open morning. If you have or know anyone that requires either a reception or Y3 place in September 2019 then please come along and see us in action.

On the 1st November Derbyshire Police will be launching a new initiative called Stopping Domestic Abuse Together (SDAT). You may see some posters and publicity around Derby. This will mean schools will received notification, within 24 hours, if a child has been present in the house whilst the domestic abuse has occurred.

What is SDAT?

- Stopping Domestic Abuse Together is a local version of the Encompass Model
- Derbyshire Constabulary lead on SDAT and aim to roll it out with all schools in Derby and Derbyshire
- It is an early notification system to schools to quickly notify them of any incidents of domestic abuse where the police have attended a household where children live.

SDAT Aims:

To provide a link between a statutory school aged child's lived home experience and their experience in school when domestic abuse is a current issue.

Helps ensure that schools can effectively support and respond to children's needs in the education setting.

Promotes effective communications between police, children's social care, education welfare and schools where there has been a domestic abuse incident.

If you would like more information on SDAT then please come and see me.

And finally, just a reminder that children should not be bringing mobile phones to school. If there is an absolute need for this then an adult needs to sign the phone into reception at the start AND end of the day.
