What we want our school to be like.

At Lawn we want our school to be a kind, happy and safe place where children can trust and enjoy one another's friendship.

We want everyone to recognise when bullying happens and for all the school family including children, parents, staff and governors to work together to stop it.



Why an anti-bullying policy is important to us.

We want to have an anti-bullying policy because we have to make sure everybody knows the right way to behave.

Some children may need help because they might not realise that they are behaving like a bully and other children need to know what to do if they are being bullied. We want to make our school as good a place as possible so children will have the confidence to come to school.



What we think bullying is.

Bullying is when children keep on being hurtful to someone over and over again and can be...

- ✚ Emotional: Hurting people's feelings, leaving people out
- ✚ Physical: Pushing, punching, kicking, spitting
- ✚ Verbal: Teasing and name calling
- ✚ Racist: Graffiti, calling racist names
- ✚ Cyber: Saying unkind things by text, e-mail or media websites



When does bullying usually happen?






Bullying usually happens when somebody else is different to you or is jealous. Bullying can sometimes happen if someone has been bullied themselves.









What we do to stop bullying happening at Lawn.

What you should do if you are bullied?

Do:

-  Ask them to stop if you can
-  Use eye contact and tell them to go away
-  Ignore them
-  Walk away
-  **TELL SOMEONE**

Don't:

-  Do what they say
-  Get angry or upset
-  Hit them
-  Think it's your fault
-  Keep it to yourself
-  Take it personally



What you should do if you see someone being bullied?

If it is safe, go up to the bully and tell them to stop

- ✚ Tell an adult
- ✚ Don't act like nothing has happening, take action

Who can you tell?

- ✚ Friend
- ✚ Year 6 Buddy
- ✚ Teacher or Teaching Assistant
- ✚ Mum or Dad/ Grown up at home
- ✚ Play worker
- ✚ Mrs Allison, Mrs Hallam or Mrs O Hare
- ✚ Mini Leader



What we promise to do to stop bullying at Lawn.

- ✚ We have lessons where we learn how to treat other people properly and how we should expect to be treated ourselves.
- ✚ We use assemblies and newsletters to talk about bullying and how to stop it.
- ✚ We encourage everyone to look out for one another.
- ✚ We can make it clear what will happen if someone does bully.
- ✚ Make sure everyone knows regularly where they can get help from.
- ✚ Be a 'telling' school.



How will we know our policy is working?

Lawn Anti-Bullying policy is working because:

- ✚ All our children will be happy and friendly.
- ✚ There will be fewer complaints.
- ✚ There are no records of incidents of bullying.
- ✚ There are no bullying worries in our worry boxes.



Who has been involved in writing this policy and when will we write it again?

Members of the school council, with the help of Mrs Hallam and the class teachers, asked the children their opinions on bullying and how to stop it. Some of the school council have designed child friendly anti-bullying posters and leaflets to remind the children at Lawn of their important work against bullying.

This policy will be looked at again during the next school year of 2016/2017
