

**Catch-up Premium: English 2016-17 Summary**

<b>Number of students eligible for catch-up premium in Reading 2016-17: 39</b>	
<b>Provision 2016-17</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Catch-up premium used to create additional classes to enable learners eligible for catch-up funding to be placed in small sets.</li> <li>• Gaps in knowledge and skills identified from KS2 QLA from Raise</li> <li>• Quality First Teaching strategies embedded to accelerate progress</li> <li>• Focus on the development of literacy skills through the use of Literacy Progress Units</li> <li>• TA support in class</li> <li>• Small group intervention and one to one intervention sessions for students using LEXIA</li> </ul>
<b>Costs 2016-17</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• LEXIA TA 1 hour 40 minutes weekly – cost £845.00</li> <li>• TA in class 8 lessons per fortnight - £13.00 /hour = £2028</li> <li>• Photocopying intervention each MP point 39 pupils cohort £57.</li> <li>• Additional HLTA 4 lessons per week /39 weeks /£17/hr = £2652.00</li> <li>• LEXIA licences £610.00</li> </ul>
<b>Impact overview</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Average improvement in reading scores of 28 months evidenced by ARTI scores</li> <li>• 22/36 students improved by 24+ months</li> <li>• 27/36 students improved by 12+ months</li> <li>• 32/36 students improved by 6+ months</li> </ul>
