CORE ENGLISH

CORE ENGLISH

Guided Reading book
Read your guided reading book every night with an adult. The book should be in your bag every day.

CORE MATHS

Practise 2x, 3x, 4x, 5x, 8x 10x tables. What patterns do you notice?

CORE MATHS

Practise counting in 50s and 100s. How far can you go?

PSHE/VALUES

This term we are focusing on KINDNESS. Donate something to charity (toy, clothes, and domestic ornaments). Tell us what you donated and where.

IPC Computing

Have a go at creating a PowerPoint presentation on the skeleton of an extinct animal.

IPC SCIENCE

Compare different types of soil and find out what they might be used for.

IPC ART

Sculpt an image of a plant, animal or shell into a potato to create the look of a fossil. Use paint to print your fossil onto cloth, canvas or paper.



IPC GEOGRAPHY

Find out if any historical artefacts have ever been discovered in your local area.

IPC HISTORY

Draw your family tree. Try going as far back as you can. Or research the Royal family's family tree.

ENGLISH

Write a recount of your last birthday.

ENGLISH

Write a story where your main character is a caveman/cavewoman. Write about an adventure they might have had when going out to hunt.

IPC- TECHNOLOGY
