Our Aims

Curriculum

The Government's 'Early Years Foundation Stage' document provides the basis for all our work with the children. It details the learning outcomes for children across seven areas of learning:-

- Understanding the World

Characteristics of Effective Learning

This is based on how the child learns.

- **Playing and Exploring** - engagement
- **Active Learning** - motivation
- **Creating and Thinking Critically** - Thinking

We value indoor and outdoor play activities and provide outstanding continuous provision to meet the needs of every child. The children are given a variety of different experiences including trips and visitors. Our highly skilled nursery staff closely monitor, observe and plan 'in the moment' based on what the child is already deeply involved in. This way of planning relies on using quality interactions to draw out the children's knowledge and build on it there and then (in the moment). This enables a deeper level of learning to take place and rapid progress to be made.



Free Places

If you are the parent or carer of a 3 or 4 year old you can claim up to 15 hours per week for a maximum of 38 weeks per year from the start of term following their 3rd birthday.

Our sessions are either 5 mornings or 5 afternoons plus one extra session each week to make up the 15 hours entitlement for 3 and 4 year olds. This means that children stay at Nursery for one full day per week.

Classes are split into 2 groups of 30 children. One group is called Sunshine and the other Rainbow.

We also have Snowflakes — a smaller class for children with Autistic Spectrum Condition.


- An extremely safe and caring setting means that children feel very secure and love to attend the nursery.

Parents/Carers

Parents are welcome to stay in school any time. After your child has settled, you may like to join us as a "helping parent" on a regular basis or just occasionally. There are many ways in which you can help, either with the children's activities or by sharing a specific skill. Regular helpers will need to undergo a Disclosure and Barring Service clearance.

Governors

We have a governing body with representatives from the local community. One of our Governors is a parent in this school and another a parent at Caversham Nursery. Both were elected by parents at their respective setting.



Links with Pre-School

We enjoy good links with our pre-schools and day nurseries. Once you have accepted a place here, please do tell the pre-school that your child will be leaving so that they can offer a place to another child on their waiting list.



Primary Schools

Children move on to the local Primary Schools - Caversham, Caversham Park, Emmer Green, Micklands, St. Anne's, St. Martin's, Thameside, The Heights and The Hill. We have excellent relationships with all of them and support transition well.
