LEARNING THIS WEEK IN CLASSES

Each week we will let you know about some of the learning in class so you can talk about this with your child.

The learning will be taken from the whole curriculum, English, maths, IPC and science, music or PE.

Nursery – we have practised climbing, planted cress seeds and read *What the Ladybird heard*

Peach and Rowan class - We have writing about aliens and looked at 3D shapes

Hazel class – we have been practising our handwriting, our phonics and learning to use numbers to 40

Holly class – we have been writing an information text and learning about multiplication. We also visited Gunnersbury House and Park

Maple class - we have been learning about the features of poetry and learning to tell the time.

Sycamore and Olive classes – we have been multiplying 2 digit numbers by one digit and reading the book *A Pebble in my Pocket*. We made freeze frames based on parts of the story.

Magnolia and Willow classes – we have learning more about fractions, writing an argument and discussing the rainforest

Elm and Plum classes – we did an experiment about dissolving materials, read the poetry of Joseph Coelho, some of us wrote information texts on poisonous animals and we learnt about percentages and decimals in maths.

Hawthorn class – we have been revising grammar, writing informal and formal letters and made a Merry-Go-Round in IPC.
