



Religious Education & Collective Worship

Religious Education, in accordance with the Agreed Syllabus of the Birmingham Education Authority, is available to all students throughout their school life. This takes the form of timetabled lessons which are part of the normal curriculum for each student. At the Post 16 level Religious Education is incorporated into the General Studies Programme which is available to all students.

Collective Worship, which is wholly, mainly or broadly of a Christian character, takes place on a daily basis. On two days of the week, this takes the form of an assembly with a theme commensurate with the requirements of legislation. The other three days follow a more general programme with particular reference to Year activities. Parents have a right to withdraw their children from Religious Education and Collective Worship. Alternative arrangements are made for students who, for religious reasons, are unable to take part in Religious Education and Collective Worship.
