Activities anyone can have a go at:

- Home sweet home

What do you know about England, can you think of some of its most famous monuments? Where are they and why are they there? Perhaps you could look at some old photos of day trips to London, or write down three places that you would like to visit and why?

If you can go for a walk, try spotting things that are physical and things that are made by humans.

- Exploring the world around you

Can you name the continents and the oceans, what about different countries and their capital cities?

Have you lived somewhere else, or maybe you have got family in another country, what is similar and what is different?

Have you ever wanted to explore somewhere else? Pick somewhere you would like to visit and investigate it, see if you can write a brochure telling other people why they should visit.

Look at flags from different countries. Can you play flag bingo? Try to design a flag for your home.

- Creating maps

Try drawing a map of your house, you could create a key with symbols or put it on a grid. Play hunting games with your maps, using directions or grid references to let someone know where you have hidden the treasure.

Create a map of a fantasy Island you would like to live on, use map elements to show the different features of the land and its people.

Plot the path of a storm or hurricane on a map, can you follow its journey from the beginning. What else can you find out about fierce weather like this?

What about a certain product, is there something you really enjoy eating? Find out where it comes from and follow its journey to get to you.
