

We will continue to work on these over the next couple of weeks. Meanwhile, they have made very vivid collage pictures of volcanoes. In Maths, we have been learning about clocks, time and rotation, with many children starting to use this knowledge in their everyday life. This concept has also been developed through the use of programmable toys: our 'Beebots'. Next week, we will be looking at multiplication, using arrays and number-lines. We owe Mrs Marsham a big 'Thank you' for picking the rhubarb in the garden and making us some delicious rhubarb cakes. Lots of children tried this fruit for the first time, a good sign of their keenness to learn - lots of resilience, reflectiveness, resourcefulness and teamwork this week, not least on Tuesday when the children transferred into their new classes for the day. The Reception children continue to be very kind to their future class-mates, and the Year 1's felt very grown-up when acting as Year 2's for the morning.

**BRISONS CLASS** - We've had a very busy yet fun week in Brisons. In Literacy we enjoyed writing about our trip to St Michael's mount and looking at our photos from the day. In our topic work we've been learning about counties and the children created great Cornwall posters. Lafrowda preparations are well underway and the children displayed excellent teamwork while creating their blue bottles in pairs.
