Use of Pupil Premium 2017-2018

Background

The Pupil Premium is allocated to children from low-income families who are currently known to be eligible for Free School Meals (FSM) in both mainstream and non-mainstream settings and children who have been looked after continuously for more than six months. This will also include pupils eligible for FSM at any point in the last six years (known as the Ever 6 FSM measure).

Schools are free to spend the Pupil Premium as they see fit. However we will be held accountable for how we have used the additional funding to support pupils from low-income families. We are required to publish online information about how we have used the Premium. This will ensure that parents and others are made fully aware of the attainment of pupils covered by the Premium and the extra support that they receive.

Our School

In 2017-1 St Alban's Catholic Primary School received £25,080 for Pupil Premium. Fifteen pupils were eligible for the Pupil Premium grant.

We propose to use our 2018-2019 Pupil Premium £19,800 to continue to ensure that there is no gap between the Pupil Premium group and the rest of the school.

Further provision for disadvantaged children will include early morning sessions, 1:1 English and Maths sessions for targeted pupils, additional resources to support literacy and numeracy, small group work and other interventions as needs arise.
