

St Francis Medium Term planning.	Theme: Ancient Egypt	Year 3 Autumn Term 2018
<p>Literacy (following National Curriculum) Speaking and listening – The children will be preparing adventure stories and poems to read aloud and perform. They will also be listening and responding to each other’s work and performances. The children will also read Non –Fiction text, write Instructions and reports.</p> <p>Reading – Through shared and guided reading, they will continue to develop their comprehension skills. This will include retrieving information from texts, drawing inferences, making predictions about plots and identifying how language, structure and presentation contribute to meaning.</p> <p>Writing – They will continue to practise writing for different purposes. There will be a focus on adventure (linked to Ancient Egypt), adventure stories and play scripts. Children will be encouraged to draft, improve and proof read their writing.</p> <p>Grammar & punctuation – Consistent use of basic punctuation and more complex sentence structures will remain areas of focus. In addition, they will be working on use of the possessive apostrophe, prefixes, suffixes, speech marks, conjunctions and adverbs.</p>	<p>Numeracy</p> <p>Pupils’ will develop understanding of number sense, reasoning within 100, place value, graphs, addition and subtraction with up to three digits. They will be learning how to calculate a perimeter. Measures will also be covered with the children measuring in kg and g and L and ml. They will compare, add and subtract measures and converting between related units e.g. kg and g. Understanding hundreds will be the focus of our place value work. They will also revise recording and retrieving data in tables, bar charts and graphs. Times tables knowledge will continue to be revisited and tested.</p>	
<p>Science Rocks Investigating the rocks. Pupils should be taught to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • compare and group together different kinds of rocks on the basis of their appearance and simple physical properties • describe in simple terms how fossils are formed when things that have lived are trapped within rock • recognise that soils are made from rocks and organic matter. 	<p>Topic</p> <p>The children will be learning about the Egyptians - Become aware of the past and how people and events fit into chronological framework. Knowledge of event, people and changes over time. Ask and answer questions about the past - Historical Enquiry. Understand the ways we find out about the past – drawing conclusions from sources. Represent the past in different ways using everyday historical/technical vocabulary.</p>	
<p>RE As a Catholic School we follow the RE teaching Scheme ‘God Matters’, which this term focuses Mission & Other Faiths, Creation, Christmas.</p>	<p>ICT</p> <p>Children will continue to practice being software developers using Purple Mash/Scratch to make computer games and animations using standard computing principals. They will develop their computer literacy by using various software application and packages to perform task in line with the National Curriculum.</p>	
<p>Art and Design and Technology The children will use research to inform the design of mummy, develop their ideas through discussion, annotated sketches and prototypes.</p>	<p>Music</p> <p>There will be no formal music lessons this term.</p>
