Numeracy skills, e.g. percentages.</p>		
<p>What can I do to help my child?</p> <p>Watch the news and keep an eye out for news stories linked to the course content Encourage them to start revision early and experiment with different revision techniques. Everything since the beginning of year 9 could be in the summer exams.</p>
