<p>What will my child be studying this term? Completing the study of the remaining set works. Composition. Performance.</p>	<p>Students will be assessed on their listening and performance skills focusing on exam style questions and mark schemes. All results will be averaged to consider all three aspects of the course (listening, composition and performance). Results will be recorded on BromCom.</p>	<p>Students will be required to regularly learn vocabulary and revise the analysis of set works completed in lessons. They will also need to listen to lots of music from different genres and eras as the exam will include a question on 'unfamiliar' music. In order to complete composition and performance, all students must</p>	<p>Students will be given more challenging stylistic features to put into their compositions. They will also be encouraged to use the rehearsal rooms at lunch or break time.</p>
<p>Content covered: Applying knowledge of set works to more exam style questions and mock papers.</p> <p>Students will regularly complete mock exams and exam style questions to further develop their mastery of the techniques required.</p> <p>Final additions and developments to compositions and performances will also be completed ready for submission.</p>			
<p>Literacy and numeracy: All vocabulary learnt over the last 3 years will be applied and revised.</p>			
<p>What can I do to help my child? Continue to test them on key vocabulary and encourage regular revision of key facts for the exam set works.</p>			
<p>Additional resources and details of core texts used: Students will benefit from using the internet to do further research on music theory and the eras of music, particularly sites such as BBC Bitesize. Youtube will be important to ensure that students can listen to a selection of pieces from different eras and may be required to complete homework. Core text books are available for the exam set works; these are available through Pearson and Rhinegold publishers. In addition there are many websites offering quizzes and other revision material; it is beneficial if these are completed little and often to encourage regular use, and application, of the vocabulary.</p>
