



## In Danger of Exclusion Programme (IDOE)

The 'In Danger of Exclusion' Programme (IDOE) is a behaviour for learning intervention designed to provide intensive support to students in Years 7-11 that are considered at high risk of either Permanent Exclusion from school or transfer/respice at a Pupil Referral Unit (PRU).

### Objective

The aim of the programme is to provide the student with time to reflect upon their negative behaviours in a supportive environment. The student will then be encouraged to take personal responsibility for improving their conduct.

We work closely with parents and their daughter in order to support her in modifying her behaviour aiming to encourage re-engagement with the mainstream curriculum. We explore whether there are any barriers to effective learning and behaviour, with the intention of developing an improved understanding, targeted strategies for staff and intervention to address any areas of need.

### The IDOE programme

The IDOE is a six week programme during which the student is supported by the Inclusion Centre staff, initially spending a week off timetable, attending lessons only for core curriculum (English, Maths and Science). During the course of the IDOE programme the student will gradually be reintegrated back into all of her mainstream lessons, with support given to the student and staff throughout, in order to address some of the barriers to learning and achievement.

### Referral

The Head of Key Stage (HKS) or Year Learning Coordinator (YLC) can refer a student to the programme using the 'IDOE Support Plan' which details previous support. Before a referral is accepted the case should be discussed with the Inclusion Team and a wide variety intervention should already have been tried.
