Teachers from schools across the country attended the evening reception, which was hosted by the Prime Minister and Secretary of State for Education. Both paid tribute to the hard work and dedication of the profession.

Mrs Foley, Curriculum Leader for Science at Teddington School, was invited to attend the event as part of her membership of the Department for Education's Teacher Reference Group and was one of a small group of 20 teachers who were selected to meet Mrs May prior to her addressing the entire group.

The Teacher Reference Group meets at the DfE every half term and acts as a confidential sounding board, advising on the potential impact of government policies on the school system, including any barriers to implementation.

Punctuality Matters

Good punctuality is an essential life skill and is a fundamental quality that we expect to see in all members of our school community. It ensures the smooth running of the school and reduces the disruption to the learning of others. Furthermore in a competitive world it is vital for future employability. All colleges, universities and employers request attendance and punctuality records when assessing young people during their application process. In addition attendance and punctuality are recorded by the school and is taken into account when a student applies for a position of responsibility within the school.

At Teddington School whilst it is recognised that some incidents of poor punctuality to school are unavoidable all students are expected to make every effort to achieve 100% punctuality where possible. When a student has a known reason for arriving late to school parents should notify the school at the earliest opportunity. Where late arrival to school is necessary due to medical, dental or optical appointments parents should ensure that these are arranged to minimise the length of absence from school.

The majority of our students are conscientious of the expectations regarding punctuality and show the integrity to adhere to this each and every day. These expectations are regularly reinforced during tutor time, assembly and the Student Briefing. The school's expectation are :

- Students should be in the main school building by 8.40 am. There is a buzzer to alert students to proceed to their form room or assembly to arrive for 8.45am;
- Any student arriving after 8.45am to form or assembly will be marked late to school. Students must be present in a place where a responsible adult can complete a formal register. Their presence in the school building is not enough to count as being present at school;
- Students who arrive later than 8.45am without an acceptable reason will receive 1 behaviour point. Those arriving after 9.00am will receive 2 behaviour points.
- Students who are late will have to attend a Late Detention for 30 minutes after school. A text notification will be sent to parents.

Once in school students are expected to arrive at lessons promptly to allow teaching and learning to commence. Poor punctuality during school is dealt with as follows:

- If poor punctuality continues without good reason a class teacher can place a student in a personal detention;

If students are late to lessons after break or lunchtime this will result in a late detention for 30 minutes after school on that day;

Repeated lateness to lessons will result in a student being placed on punctuality report to their tutor or Head of Year.

Well done to our students who take responsibility to ensure that they are never late to school or lessons.






Congratulations to the following students for their excellent Lamda (London Academy of Music and Dramatic Art) acting exam results:



News from the Sixth Form



Year 12 Opportunity: Study Days at Oriel College, University of Oxford

Oriel's Study Day programme is a series of five subject specific, one-night residentials for Year 12 students from UK state schools. All expenses, such as accommodation at Oriel, all meals, activities, and travel are fully funded. There are 40 places available on each study day.

The Study Day programme is designed to give students from schools or backgrounds with limited experience of Oxbridge the opportunity to experience living and studying at Oriel and at Oxford, and learn about the application process for their chosen subject.

Students arrive in the afternoon/evening prior to the full day programme. The college offers an off-peak return train ticket from any UK station for every attendee. Students will have an opportunity to look around the sights of the University and familiarise themselves with Oxford and eat dinner in the college dining hall before staying overnight in student accommodation (single rooms).

Three Study Days will be hosted in August 2018:

28-29 August: Physics— students must be studying Maths and Physics A-Levels and be predicted A*AA or above, with A* in at least one from Maths, Further Maths, or Physics;

29-30 August: English—students must be studying English Literature or English Literature & Language A-Level, and be predicted AAA or above;

30-31 August: Classics: the Ancient World - any combination of A-Levels predicted AAA or above accepted. No prior experience of studying Classics or a classical language is required.

Applications are now open until 9am on Monday 23 July and only take about 5 minutes to complete.
