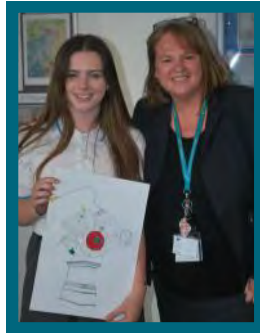
- 87% A*-C in 2018 and more than one in five entries attaining A* or A

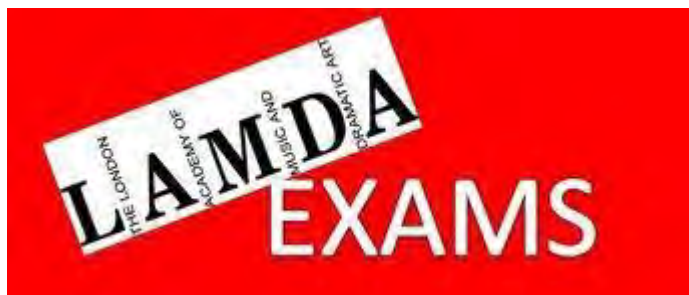

For the whole of human history, the birds have tried to show us how to fly and only in the last 130 years have we started to understand their lessons.
