<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Regular specialist support from qualified PE teachers (Sport Impact) working with The Blue School primary staff to achieve high quality teaching and learning in lessons.</li> </ul> <p>(focus has been gymnastics in year 4 and year 6).</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Teachers worked with Sport Impact staff to deliver quality assured teaching modules, utilising age appropriate materials for PE &amp; Sport.</li> <li>• CPD opportunities have been offered for teachers in national and bespoke programmes in PE and Sport. Cover has been provided to release the PE Co-ordinator for professional development training in PE and sport, including attending an annual PE Conference.</li> <li>• Participation in inter school tag-rugby and Indoor athletics competitions have been organised by the sports impact so far this year, which provided pupils with the opportunity to compete against other schools.</li> </ul> <p>Transport to and from venues has been arranged.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Year 5/6 Football and Netball tournaments have been organised by sports impact which gave our children an opportunity to compete against other schools. Also a Year 2 indoor athletics competition has been organised where 10 children will compete against 48 other schools. Transport to and from venues has been arranged.</li> <li>• Teachers worked with Sport Impact staff to deliver quality assured teaching modules, utilising age appropriate materials for PE &amp; Sport. Year 6 particularly benefitted from a series of gymnastics lessons over a period of 6</li> </ul>	<p>Part of the 70% allocation</p> <p>£6370</p>	<p>This led to improved teacher expertise in targeted year groups, improved quality of provision and a high quality of learning and improved pupil skills</p> <p>The children received quality, specialist gymnastic teaching. The children's gymnastic skills have improved significantly as have their coordination and body control. The planning is exceptional and a higher standard and the teachers feel far more confident and prepared to deliver high quality lessons. This has also increased participation and enjoyment amongst boys.</p> <p>This has increased sports participation, enabled children the opportunity to compete against other schools and play the sport for a purpose. Children had the chance to consolidate their skills that have been taught and they had learnt at school. It also promoted a healthy lifestyle, improved their coordination, fitness levels and helped them to become team players and teach them good sportsmanship.</p>

<p>weeks.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• All year 1 and year 2 children have received a weekly session of tennis coaching delivered by Dukes Meadow tennis coaches. Children have been taught the fundamental skills of tennis, also skills such as balance and coordination. 16 children from year 4 have also had a session of coaching delivered by Dukes Meadow to prepare them for an inter school tennis competition against other schools.</li> <li>• Teachers and children have worked with Sport Impact staff to deliver quality assured teaching modules, utilising age appropriate materials for PE &amp; Sport. Year 2 and Year 5 particularly benefitted from a series of games lessons over a period of 6 weeks.</li> <li>• Another Tag-Rugby competition has been organised by Sports Impact for year 5 children. This is a preliminary round in preparation for the World Cup Rugby in October. Transport to and from venues has been arranged.</li> <li>• Dukes Meadows staff have organised a Tennis competition against other schools in the borough. Children from year 4 will be competing. Transport has also been arranged.</li> <li>• Staff attended a PE teacher training tennis course to improve and refresh their teaching and knowledge of tennis. As a result the school have received tennis equipment for children to use during their PE lessons.</li> </ul>		<p>This led to improved teacher expertise in targeted year groups, improved quality of provision and a high quality of learning and improved pupil skills. Also, the new curriculum has been embedded.</p> <p>A larger variety of tennis resources are now available for children to use during their PE lessons.</p>
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<p>Cover will be provided for the coordinator to write reports, update the school website, analyse club participation and write termly newsletters.</p> <p>A wide variety of extra-curricular after-school clubs are offered to all children in years 1 - 6 (see <a href="#">Curriculum / After-school Clubs</a> for further details).</p> <p>The school subsidises a large proportion of the cost of coaches to keep the price of clubs low so no child is disadvantaged</p> <p>The expansion of the school's buildings now offers a zoned playground to encourage physical activity during non-curriculum time.</p> <p>All pupils will be due to complete a cycle proficiency test in years 5 and 6.</p> <p>Children now have new playground markings for use at playtimes and during some curriculum times.</p> <p>Each class has been allocated their own large bucket of equipment, such as, balls, footballs and skipping ropes to be used during their playtimes.</p> <p>A broad range of extra-curricular after school clubs have been offered to all children in years 1 to 6. There has been a variety of new clubs to attract more children.</p> <p>Parents of 2 children have volunteered their coaching services to our school football team. The coaches train the team twice a week.</p> <p>Two year 5 boys have set up and organised an intra-football tournament in the junior classes. This has been held during their lunchtime.</p> <p>Free places have been offered to 'pupil premium' children and children with additional needs to take part in extra-curricular clubs such as, dance, tennis and gymnastics.</p> <p>A wide variety of extra-curricular after-school clubs are offered to all children in years 1 - 6 during the Summer term. Children are more active and are spending more time partaking in physical activity.</p> <p>Children have become more active during their day and their friendship groups have grown.</p>
