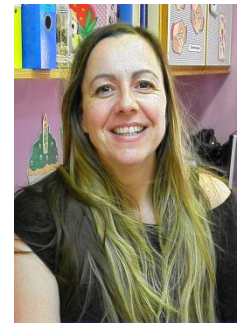

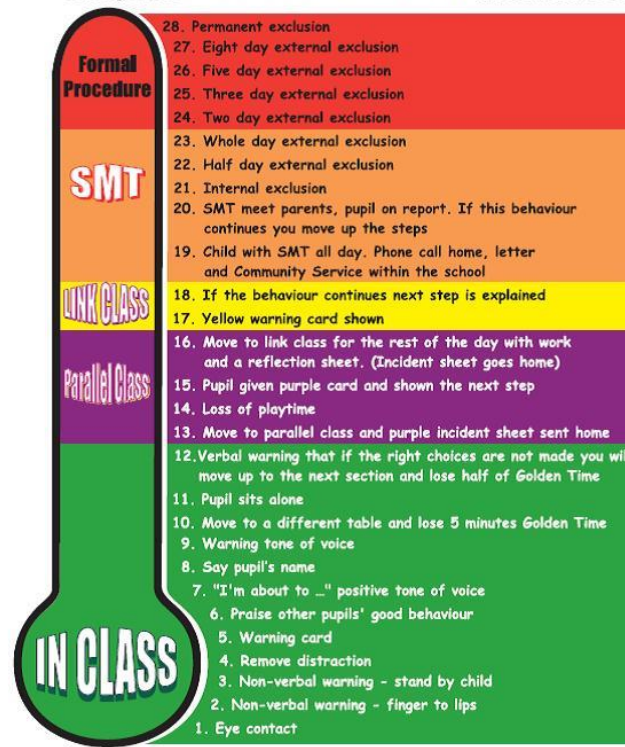

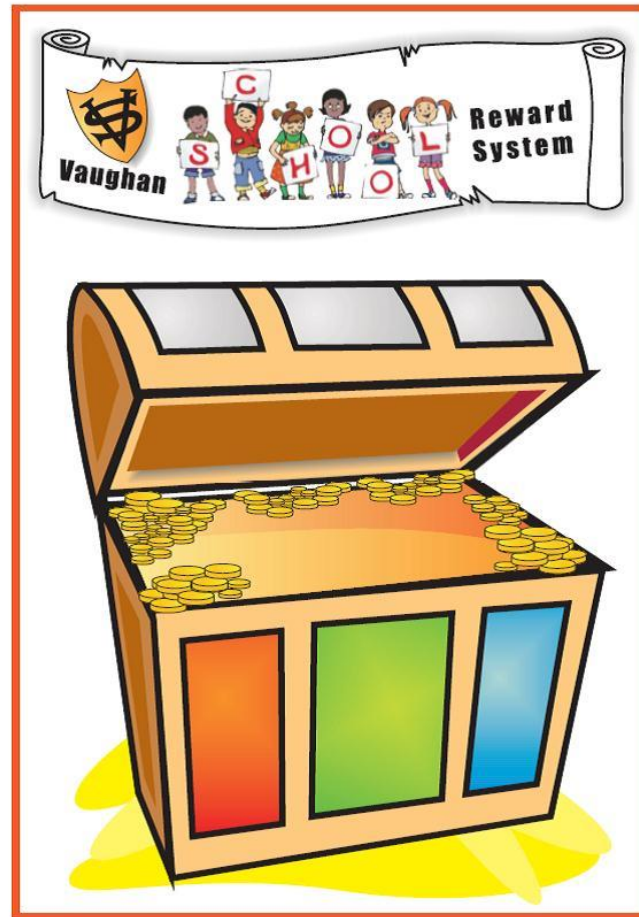

- Our PE kit consists of a plain white t-shirt with or without the Vaughan logo, burgundy or black shorts (e.g. Umbro), white socks and plimsolls or well fitting trainers. Children may wear a plain track suit in cold weather at the discretion of the teacher.
- All clothing should be named and easily identifiable.
- No jewellery is to be worn on PE days.
- Recently pierced ears should be covered with tape for 6 weeks after piercing.

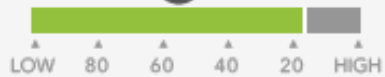

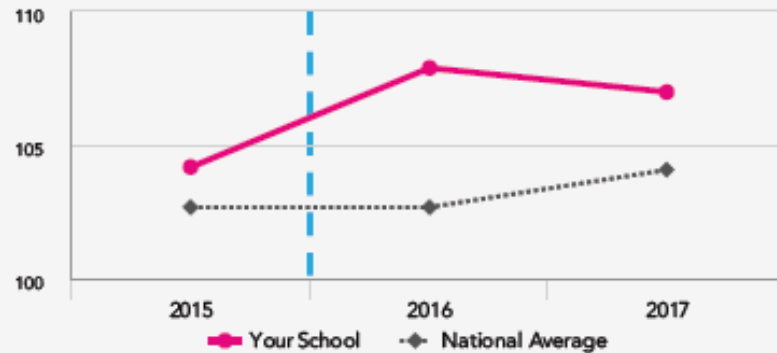

Significantly above the national average (104.1)



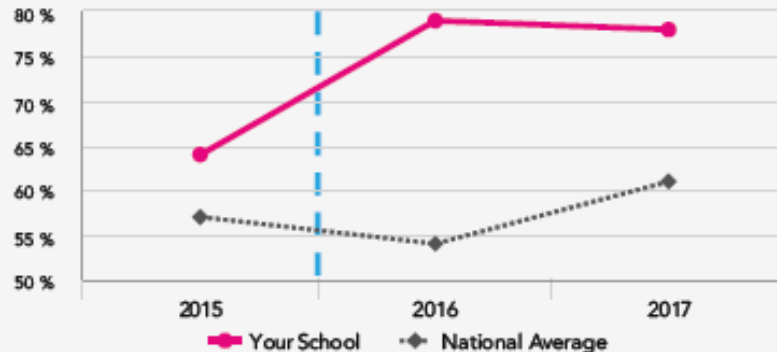

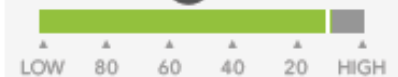

Year 1 Phonics Screening Check

All pupils in Year 1 will undergo a statutory test for Phonics in the Summer term of Year 1. This test is designed to assess your child's understanding of how to use the sound system and is not a test of their reading.

The official test will take place in June 2017, but your child will be undergoing regular monitoring and assessment in the classroom before this date. This assessment is a directive from the Government. It is not a school initiative.

A meeting for Year 1 Parents will take place later this term with more detailed information about this process. The date for this meeting is Thursday 12th October 2017.

Year 1 EAL Parent Workshop

There will be a workshop for parents with pupils in school who have English as an additional language.

Parents will be invited to discuss ways to support pupils with teaching and explaining strategies in the English School system. The workshop will be about using Phonics and Rhyme. The date for this workshop is **Wednesday 29th November 2017.**

Daily Reminders

- Please make sure your child brings a water bottle and their book bag to school every day.
- Please ensure your child is appropriately dressed for all weather conditions. Every child in Year 1 must have a coat in school every day.
- Please clearly place your child's name on all their possessions.
- Homework should be completed and returned on Wednesday.
- Reading Logs should be fully completed and signed each week. If it is not completed when checked by staff, no reward star will be given.
- Check daily for letters being sent home and return any relevant slips promptly to the class teacher.
