STEAM - Science, technology, engineering, arts and maths.

Today saw the introduction of our STEAM teams; where children will spend an hour and a half every Friday afternoon in their coloured teams (using their sports day coloured teams) working in a class with children from Y3-Y6 (with their siblings) planning, designing, making, evaluating, being creative, problem solving, working collaboratively, making mistakes and learning from them and having fun!! Each half term they will have a project to work on. This half term all STEAM teams are beginning with the project "Ready, Steady, Invent!" where they will become inventors!

In assembly today we have looked at several inventions that were invented my mistake; the frisbee, the post-it note, the Slinky and Coca-Cola to name but a few. During this half term we have been looking at what it means to have a growth mind-set; where we understand that making mistakes is all part of the learning process and that mistakes are not failures but learning opportunities.
