

Allerton High celebrates another year of outstanding GCSE and A Level results!

Students and staff worked incredibly hard, securing excellent outcomes yet again this summer. There were some fabulous results by individual students in Years 10-13 in a wide range of subjects. We are extremely proud of the determination and resilience our students displayed and delighted that they achieved the success they deserved.

Exceptional GCSE results 2018

Year 11 students at Allerton High achieved excellent results across a broad range of subjects yet again, despite considerable national change and turbulence. Progress 8 is 0.69. The Progress 8 score measures students' progress from their starting point across eight subjects and a score of +0.69 means that on average all of our students achieved not far off a full grade better than expected in ALL subjects.

English and Maths results are strong again with 59% of students achieving a grade 5 or higher in both subjects (National average in 2018 was 40%). Attainment across all subjects was also very high with an average grade of 5.5 across 8 subjects (an average of Grade B). The proportion of 9-7 and A/A* grades remained high with more than 10% of students achieving a clean sweep of top grades.

Sam Brassil achieved 8 GCSEs at Grade 9 and 3 A*s; Jude Spellacy achieved 7 GCSEs at Grade 9, 2 at Grade 7 and an A* despite crashing his bike and breaking his elbow on the way to the first exam. He was so determined to do himself justice that he insisted on sitting his first paper before going to A&E! The following students also received mostly grade 8 and 9s: Ben Hollis, Luke Poppleton, Molly O'Holloran, Teaghan Riches, Anna Alderson, Anna Mughal, Jasveen Manic, Robbie Shillito, Henry Steele-Child, Bob Oram, Sylvie Rogers, Annie Chu, Megan Rosser, Adam Benkreira, Ramayah Peter, Jade Stapleton-Smith, Reehan Yousef. Marwa and Safa Ahmed achieved a total of 16 Grade 7 to 9s between them, despite English being their 3rd language.

Amazing A Level Results 2018

2018 has been another fantastic year for Year 13 students at Allerton High School. We were delighted with the exam results of our students, their varied contributions to the school and local community and also the destinations that they secured.

44% of the A level grades awarded were A*, A or B grades and the overall pass rate was 99%. One quarter of grades achieved were A*/A Grades with 14% of students achieving a clean sweep of top grades. Sabrina Lethenyey achieved 4A* Grades and an EPQ graded A* and will be reading Law at Oxford with a year in Paris at the Sorbonne. Lucy Nicholson, Abisola Ibrahim, Simarpreet Rayat, Tamara Shaffner and Josh Weatherill each achieved 1A* and 2 A Grades and Dani Waldenberg achieved 3 A Grades.

89 of the 96 students seeking a University place were placed this year with strong apprenticeship and sponsored degree programme options also secured. One third of our students who went to University places were at the more prestigious Russell Group Universities, including Zain Ahmed and Yin Hoang who are going to study Dentistry.
