



| What does the new Curriculum Model mean for my son/daughter...? | 2018/19 |
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| Infants and Juniors up to Year 5 | If your son/daughter is currently in the Infant School or in Years 3, 4 or 5 of the Junior School, they will benefit from both our new Infant/Junior Curriculum and the new Senior School Curriculum. |
| Year 6 | If your son/daughter is currently in Year 6, every element of the new Senior School Curriculum Model will be available to them. |
| Year 7 | If your son/daughter is currently in Year 7, every element of the new Senior School Curriculum Model will be available to them, except the proposed changes to Modern Languages and Latin. (They will continue with the languages they have started in Year 7.) |
| Year 8 | If your son/daughter is currently in Year 8, they will select their GCSE options in February 2018 . This year group will be the first year group to undertake a three-year GCSE course and choose their options in Year 8. In the coming weeks, there will be an options evening, careers meetings and individual interviews with senior staff to discuss options and next steps. |
| Year 9 | If your son/daughter is currently in Year 9, they will select their GCSE options in February 2018 . This year group will follow a two-year GCSE course, benefitting from more teaching time in English and Mathematics and more time per cycle for each GCSE subject. They will also have the option to pursue the Duke of Edinburgh Award or the Higher Project Qualification. |
| Year 10 | If your son/daughter is currently in Year 10, they will continue with their GCSE options into Year 11 and will select their A Level options in January 2019 . They will benefit from the substantial amount of extra A Level teaching time in the Sixth Form. |
| Year 11 | If your son/daughter is currently in Year 11, they will select their A Level options in February 2018 . More details will follow in the forthcoming Sixth Form Open Evening. This cohort will be the first year group to benefit from the substantial increase in A Level teaching time for the duration of their Sixth Form courses. |
| Year 12 | If your son/daughter is currently in Year 12, they will continue with their chosen A Level subjects into Year 13 and will benefit from the substantially increased teaching time for each A Level in the crucial, final year of their A Level studies. |
