Sickness and Absence




Attendance has improved across the Primary phase which means that all the children are in school and learning!

Polite Reminder: If your child is unwell, please make sure you call the primary office by 9.00am to explain their absence. Leave a message with your child's name, class and reason.



We had fun sporting our moustaches and raised money for Men's Health by supporting Movember last week. Thanks to your generous donations on the gates, we raised a whopping £130.00.


