

Cookie Policy

What is a cookie?

Cookies are small and simple text files that are placed on a user's computer by the websites they visit. They allow the website to identify the user's device and thus provide a more personalised experience.

What does Reigate School use cookies for?

The Reigate School website uses "session cookies" to provide us with anonymous statistics on pages visited and to aid in some site functionality. These session cookies are deleted when you leave the site.

In some instances we will also use "persistent cookies." These will be only to remember simple settings on the website. Persistent cookies remain on the user's device after leaving the website, but will expire after a fixed period of time; typically 12 months.

None of the cookies we use collect any identifiable information, or track the user's activity on websites other than this one.

What about third parties?

Our website includes content from selected third parties, e.g. Google. In these instances, policies should be checked with the party concerned.

What if I don't agree?

Modern web browsers can be configured to reject cookies if the user wishes. While users can continue to browse our website with cookies disabled, we cannot guarantee full functionality. Additionally, cookies must be enabled for users wishing to log in.

Why are you telling me this?

EU law requires websites to inform visitors of their use of cookies and to acquire consent. By continuing to use our website, visitors are agreeing to the use of cookies as laid out on this page.

The Reigate School website uses cookies in several places – we've listed each of them below with more details about why we use them and how long they will last.

Authen	Authentication session to prevent having to login multiple times in one browser session.	Hashed data of username and authentication status	Expires on exit
ASP.NET_Session	This cookie contains the user's session ID and the cookie will expire at the end of the session (when you close your browser). This cookie does not store personal data about you.		Expires on exit
Style	Improves accessibility by storing the visitor's preference on whether to activate the standard, high visibility or printer friendly style sheet with each page load.	'standard', 'high' or 'print'	24 Hours

Please be aware that restricting cookies may impact on the functionality of our website.

If you wish to view your cookie code, just click on a cookie to open it. You'll see a short string of text and numbers. The numbers are your identification card, which can only be seen by the server that gave you the cookie.

For information on how to do this on the browser of your mobile phone you will need to refer to your handset manual.
